



1914 and The Great War is also the theme of the opening ceremony, the very popular procession of decorated barrows – sponsored this year by **Nat West**. Elsewhere, in addition to the local historians mentioned in the April edition of inSPIRE, we hope to include a couple of amazing WW1 themed ideas from our community groups in the Main Arena programme. Rub-a-Dub plan to recognise the importance of birds in the war while the youth of the village will be trying to solve tricky leadership and command tasks. Sounds interesting right??

In addition to all this, we have the celebrated mix of traditional and new stalls selling books, cakes, makeovers and all manner of other things alongside the bottle stall and tombola, the BBQ, cream teas, the bar – complete with **Net's Golden Bucket**, and, introducing for his debut at the fete, **Mr Brown's Pig!** I'm still not quite certain whether that is Mr Brown or his pig or both but apparently all will become clear to me nearer the time I am assured.







DERRY HILL BOOK CLUB

“And the mountains echoed” by Khaled Hosseini

This is another fantastic read from the author of “The Kite Runner”. Hosseini again centres his characters in Afghanistan opening the story with the words, “So then, you want a story and I will tell you one” and he does.



Hosseini uses short stories to introduce us to each character but creating a complex and compelling tapestry as he weaves his story providing focus through the eyes of each of his main characters; his stories contain shades of light and darkness, clarity and confusion, structure and chaos, he brings one then another to the fore, revisiting and developing themes and constantly challenging the reader to think, to question to engage.

Hosseini follows his characters through 60 years of Afghan and personal history introducing us to the deceptively innocent rural villages, where a father tells his son a story of a mystical Div who steals a child; to Kabul ; to a country at war then follows the threads of his tale to Paris, America and Greece. Each element could be viewed alone and would feel complete but the book provides us with the opportunity to stand back, reflect and wonder at the impact events, decisions and circumstance has on individuals, could this be the “Echo” Hosenni refers to in his title? It is a book you will read, talk about and re-read seeing something different in it each time you pick it up. Review by Emir Kullar

CALNE WITHOUT PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

(Derry Hill and Studley are a part of the Calne Without Parish)

The Parish Council met on **12th May**.

Proceedings opened with the Annual Meeting. Ed Jones was unanimously re-elected as Chairman. Sadly Barry Miller, the existing Deputy Chairman tendered his resignation just before the meeting making a vacancy in the East ward and for the Deputy Chairmanship. We decided to defer the appointment to this post until the June meeting. The East ward vacancy will be advertised in the press.

Ed Jones reported that consideration was still being given to the fatal crash at Mile Elm and the inquest would probably be the basis on which any road improvements, including signage, were made.

Ed Jones and I reported that the Neighbourhood Planning group (Calne town and Calne Without) were looking at consultation with the public in the near future as part of the process of creating a Neighbourhood Plan. As Calne Town had already carried out such a 'scoping' exercise recently, most of the work has to be done in Calne Without. This will be in the form of questionnaires and public meetings.

The Parish Council's response to the planning application for 28 houses on the Blount's Court site will be made at our next meeting. This will be held in the main hall as it is expected that a large number of members of the public will attend.

As some information and clarity was needed on the role of settlement boundaries and housing allocation in the Derry Hill and Studley area, councillors from the West Ward of the Parish will be meeting with the senior spatial planning officer and some members of the Studley Residents group. The non-town area of the Calne Community Area has to find space for approximately 88 houses in the period up to 2026.

The Hills Waste application for a permanent recycling site at Lower Compton and the Calne Aggregates application to extend the operation of their facility off Abberd Lane in Calne were discussed at some length. It was felt that these operations should be moved nearer main arterial routes and not be based in the Calne area.

THE NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICE TEAM

PCSO Nicolle Yates and myself have had a busy month so far, visiting the Rural Schools and attending our Parish Council meetings along with the pleasure of meeting with you on our travels. I am awaiting the printing of our new information notices which will shortly be put up in the villages with pictures and contact details so that you know who we are if we have not yet had chance to meet. In addition, please do keep an eye on our website for details of places we will be, if anyone wishes to speak with us, or just meet up. If you have any Coffee mornings or similar that you would be happy for us to join and make ourselves available to meet residents or visitors, please do send us an email as we will happily oblige.

I have to report that the Rural area has been struck by several Burglaries since the beginning of April to the date of my report - 12th May. Sadly, we have suffered several shed and workshop breaks. These burglaries have been at Foxham, Compton Bassett and Stockley. A large amount of tools have been stolen, along with a Horse trailer and a Landrover. We have also suffered losses from parked unattended vehicles – largely from 4x4 vehicles, where parts have been removed overnight.

The old Coach road at Headington leads to Roundway Hill and has become an attraction for Off Roaders, who ride on the byways in 4x4 vehicles and destroy the Byway sufficient that it renders it not useable for walkers or Horse riders. Worse of all is the detriment to the Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI), where plants and wildlife have been destroyed by the Off Roaders riding off the byway, due to it being made impassable, because of the riding. Natural England have erected concrete boulders at the entrance and put a road closure on this byway. Sadly, this has made no difference to some, who have attended the location late at night with Landrover Defenders and pulled the concrete boulders away to give access to the militant few who continue to use the byway despite it being closed.

Please may I ask that if you see anything suspicious, no matter how small, to give the Police a call, or alternatively take a registration number of any vehicle you don't recognise. Just forward them to me and I will let you know the results of any enqs I can make. Despite these reports, Wiltshire is still one of the safest Counties in which to live, and the Rural beat of Calne is particularly peaceful and beautiful. *Police Constable Sonya Stockhill*

PAVALOVA

Turn oven onto 200 or GM 6 to start.

- 1 & half Cups of caster sugar
- 3 Egg whites
- 1 tspn Vinegar (malt)
- 1 dspn Cornflour
- 1 tspn Vanilla Essence
- 4 tbspn Boiling Water

Put all the ingredients into your mixing bowl and whisk until stiff peaks form. This could take anything from 10-15 minutes.

Pour mixture onto a lined baking tray. I mark out a circle and pour it to fill. Make sure the edges are slightly higher than the centre.

Put into the oven. If using an electric oven, once the pavlova is in turn the oven off and leave for at least 3hrs, preferably overnight. If using a gas oven, once the pavlova has gone in turn the oven to GM1 for an hour then turn the oven off and leave until oven cold.

The pavlova should peel away from the lining base easily, if not it needs to have a bit longer. Pop the oven back on a really low heat and keep an eye on it. There is nothing worse than a burnt pavlova!

To serve, whisk up some double cream (feel free to flavour it with vanilla essence, rum, sherry if you like) until it holds its shape. Spoon into centre of pavlova, make sure you get it to the edges too. The fruit topping is really one of personal choice, I rather like passion fruit poured over the cream but my mum thinks it looks like frog spawn! The fruit you choose needs to be a bit sharp, this compliments the sweetness of the pavlova and cream, raspberries are good as are kiwi fruit.

The pavlova itself can be made in advance, though temptation always leads us to cracking off the edges every time we go by it.....It maybe wise to put in in a sealed box!
