

## STUDLEY MANOR AND RUMSEY'S FARM

With the passing from our local history of the Studley and Cricklade families, our local manorial history starts to become more disparate, and revolve around larger farm houses (like small manors), some of which are still standing today. Take a stroll down Studley Lane and you will see them.

A small estate in Studley was probably held by John Norborne in **1596**, and was held by him in **1602** and until his death in **1635**. It passed in turn to his son Humphrey and then his son William. In **1692** William and his son Humphrey sold the estate, then consisting of a house and **75** acres, to Benedict Browne.

In **1728** Browne (d**1737**) owned about **158** acres at Studley including Rumsey's farm, of **72** acres with buildings southeast of Studley village and south of the London-Bristol road, and a home farm of **68** acres with buildings nearby north of the road. The whole estate (later called Rumsey's) passed in turn to Browne's sons William (d**1749**) and Benedict (d**1766**) and descended in the direct line to Benedict (d**1786**), who apparently took the surname Angell, and Benedict Browne, who took the surname Angell in **1800**. From Angell (d**1856**) Rumsey's passed to his son JCB Angell (d**1878**), whose son JBO Angell sold it to Henry Petty-Fitzmaurice, Marquis of Lansdowne, in **1912**. The estate thereafter descended with Bowood House and, except Rumsey House (which was sold in **1981**), belonged to Charles, Marquis of Lansdowne, in **1999**.

The house on Benedict Browne's home farm in **1728** had formal gardens north and east of it by **1773** and was called Studley House in **1785**. The house on its site in **1996** was a farmhouse, Rumsey Farm, in the **19th** century. It incorporates a **16th**-century doorway in a rear wing, a **17th**-century stone-mullioned window, but is mainly later **18th**-century. Around the house there are outbuildings and walled enclosures including, to the east, a walled garden with mid-**18th**-century doorways and a clairvoyée<sup>1</sup>. About **1800** Rumsey House (of stone and with a main three-storied north front) was built on or near the site of the farmstead south of the London road for Benedict Angell. Soon afterwards a two-storied block was built on the south, and north-south wings, overlapping the south block. In the later **19th** century the south block was extended eastwards and a veranda was built along its south front.





## HOLY WEEK 21<sup>ST</sup> - 26<sup>TH</sup> MARCH

In **Christ Church** on **21<sup>st</sup>** and **22<sup>nd</sup>** we will come together again for a quiet time of contemplation involving a short reflection with music followed by **Compline** – Night Prayer. # CALNE WITHOUT PARISH COUNCIL

*(Derry Hill and Studley are in this Parish)*

The Council, met on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> February.

The Chairman advised councillors that so far nobody has volunteered to take over the job of looking after the War Memorial gardens.

Councillor Bell is to look into getting a local contractor to carry out what is necessary. The sub



group looking into applications for project funding reported that there were several applications in the pipeline including help for the Scout hut, Wild Flower Beds and help with the Lansdowne Hall extension. (Details of this grants scheme is on the Council's website – See below)

Under planning Councillor Crisp (Calne Rural Wiltshire Councillor) mentioned that Wiltshire Council's Highways department were still discussing the road crossing for the development of Blount's Court. Councillors agreed that the best outcome, if Blount's Court were to be developed, would be traffic lights at the Studley junction with proper crossing for pedestrians.

Three councillors agreed to go to a meeting on Emergency Planning in February, to look into how emergencies in the area were to be handled.

On Neighbourhood Planning it was announced that four workshops were to be held; two in Derry Hill (February 27<sup>th</sup>) and two in Calne Town (March 4<sup>th</sup>). Leaflets were to be delivered to all households in the Plan Area asking the public to come along for two hours to give their views on what the Plan contained so far.

There was much discussion on an issue raised by a member of the public with Wiltshire Council and then referred to this Parish Council. The member had asked for a pedestrian tunnel under the A4 to be considered. In the end the council voted by a majority against supporting the idea, wishing to have a more comprehensive solution to the crossing of the A4 and wished to see what was going to happen with the Blount's Court application also.

The next **meeting** will be on **7<sup>th</sup> March 7.30pm** in the **Lansdowne Hall**.



## BOOK CLUB REVIEW

### "The Memory Box" by Margaret Forster

I chose "*The Memory Box*" by Margaret Forster because I thought the central concept sounded interesting. The main character, Catherine, lost her mother when she was six months old but has been left a mysterious box. Catherine shows little curiosity about this until, following the death of her father and stepmother, she finds it in the attic and explores its contents. It contains eleven seemingly random items, including a seashell, a paint box and a hat, all numbered and carefully wrapped and this sends her off on a journey of discovery about her mother and ultimately about herself.



The book is beautifully written, the places she visits, from the Lake District to the Caribbean are vividly described and the minor characters are well drawn but some of our members were underwhelmed by both the story and by Catherine. She is a rather spoiled and directionless young lady, who failed to find sympathy and the ending was not satisfying to everyone. We wondered why a mother who was dying would leave all these random items with no explanation but I thought it was highly original and an easy and enjoyable read and I would recommend it. It also provoked a huge amount of discussion making it a good book club choice even if it doesn't appeal to all tastes.

# EASTER CHOCOLATE BROWNIES

Set oven to GM4, 180°C. Line a baking pan

<b>375g</b>	Soft butter
<b>375g</b>	Dark Chocolate
<b>6</b>	Large Eggs
<b>1 tbsn</b>	Vanilla extract
<b>500g</b>	Caster Sugar (you can use less if you want, I often do)
<b>225g</b>	Plain flour
<b>1 tspn</b>	Salt



Mini chocolate Easter eggs. I used Cream eggs but use whichever ones you like.

Melt butter and chocolate over a low heat. When melted leave to cool for a few minutes.

Put eggs, sugar and vanilla into a jug and mix well. Measure out the flour and add the salt.

Pour the melted Chocolate and butter into the egg and sugar mixture and mix well. Then add the flour and salt to the jug, mix well.

Pour this into a lined baking tin.

Unwrap the eggs and pop them into the mixture. I have to have mine in rows but feel free to be more freelance with them.

Bake in the oven for **20** mins, it should still be a bit wobbly on top.

This is a Nigella recipe that I use time and time again. You can literally add whatever you want to it, nuts, dried fruit, Cherry jam and it always comes out smelling and tasting yummy.

## A MESSAGE FROM ACTION FRAUD

The official looking scam emails claiming to be from Royal Mail contain a link to a document which will install malicious software on your computer designed to steal credentials like account names, email addresses and passwords. An example email reads:

**Title:** Your parcel has been seized

Royal Mail is sorry to inform you that a package addressed to you was seized by HM Revenue & Customs upon arrival into the United Kingdom.

A close inspection deemed your items as counterfeit and the manufacturers have been notified. If your items are declared genuine then they will be returned back to you with the appropriate custom charges.

You may have been a victim of counterfeit merchandise and the RM Group UK will notify you on how to get your money back. Please review the attached PDF document for more information.

Please accept our apologies for any inconvenience this may have caused.

To help the spread of the virus, the email also says: “***you will need to have access to a computer to download and open the Zip file***”. If you receive one of these emails, do not click on any links or download any attachments and report it to Action Fraud.

- Royal Mail will never send an email asking for credit card numbers or other personal or confidential information.
- Royal Mail will never ask customers to enter information on a page that isn't part of the Royal Mail website.
- Royal Mail will never include attachments unless the email was solicited by a customer e.g. customer has contacted Royal Mail with an enquiry or has signed up for updates from Royal Mail.
- Royal Mail have also stressed that they do not receive a person's email address as part of any home shopping experience.

## GARDENING STEVE

Hi,

I hope now things are beginning to grow well in the garden.

The daffodils are certainly early this year and the tulips are shooting out of the ground. Roses are bursting into leaf so I think we are going to have an early show of colour. You can now start to mow the lawns more regularly, be careful not to mow too short. Begin now to fertilize all borders with blood, fish and bone. After that, mulch with a good layer of leaf mould or horse manure, this will get the shrubs off to a good start. Sow half-hardy annuals where you intend them to flower. Sow sweet peas outdoors or plant out the young plants. Plant out early potatoes. Water indoor plants regularly now the weather is warmer and start to open the vents in the greenhouse when it is sunny.

There is still time to plant climbers. Make sure supports such as wires are fixed up before you buy and plant. Wires may stand out at first but are soon hidden by the plants. Vine eyes are invaluable when attaching wires to walls.

When you're visiting the Bowood terraces this year have a look at the walls and see how we support the climbers on the walls.



## ARTICLE FROM THE PAST

### Hints for Women, March 1955

#### Monday's Washing

*Long Sleeves.* Garments with long sleeves dry better if the line is slipped through the sleeves. If it is inconvenient to pass the actual line through, a length of strong cord secured to the line will serve. Even heavy coats are not difficult to dry in this way.

#### Tuesday's Sewing

*More elasticity.* When casting on and casting off stitches for the welt, cuffs and neck of jumpers and coatees, etc., use a needle two sizes larger than those used

in knitting the remainder of the garment. It adds to the elasticity in the wool.

#### Wednesday's Nursing

*To keep a bandage* tightly rolled for further use, place end between a fairly large pair of scissors, turning the scissors over until only a few inches of bandage are left. Then pull at the end. It tightens round the scissors and can easily be pulled off.

#### Thursday's Cooking

*Vegetables for cooking* should be placed in boiling water with salt already added, because salt water has a higher boiling point. Slow heating from cold wastes flavour and vitamins.

#### Friday's Household

*Use a plant pot.* Put a small clean plant pot in either corner of the sink or draining board. Into it go pot scourers, small brushes, etc. These drain beautifully and can be easily rinsed under a running tap.
