### **Rector's notes for April 2025**

I've just clocked up 10 years since I took up running, as an attempt to stop my middle-aged spread from spreading any further. It's only ever first thing in the morning that I run, and in the winter it's always dark so I wear a lot of hi-vis, and a chest torch, and stick to street-lit pavements in Calne. Then as the mornings get lighter, I really love being able to get out into the lanes to the villages – or right across the Bowood Estate. I even made it to Foxham once last year, though that involved running up Wick Hill on the way home, which I've vowed not to try again!

In February each year something wonderful happens, which is that blackbirds start singing just before dawn while I'm out. If I ever had to choose my desert island discs, one of them would of a blackbird singing at dawn. I'm aware that it's really singing to attract a mate, and defend its territory from rivals, but to my ears it's the most wonderful and delightful sound and makes my soul sing! Not only that, but it speaks



to me of something truly amazing about God's created order: that a bird aged 25-60 days old can learn to sing, listening and practising, and end up singing the same beautiful pattern of notes all its forebears did.

The dawn chorus of birds is one of the things I particularly enjoy about our Easter Day dawn service, timed to start in the dark, and encompass this moment of creation coming to life as we mark the resurrection of Jesus once again. This year it will happen at 5.15am in the churchyard at St Mary's Church in Calne, and people from across all our parishes are very welcome – perhaps we might hold it at another church next year. It recalls the moment in John's gospel we read this 'Very early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, the women went to the tomb'. As we well know they went expecting to find Jesus' dead body but found instead the risen Saviour. In our service, we light a fire, and while the fire takes hold we simply listen, just as dawn is breaking, while all

sorts of different bird species are at their peak tunefulness – almost like they too are singing the praises of the one who has been raised from the dead.

Of course, we have a fair bit of Lent to journey through still, and the intensity and trauma of Holy Week - living again through Jesus's suffering. But the night will not last forever. May God be with us through whatever dark times we might be enduring at the moment, and in due time fill us again with the joy and life of Jesus' resurrection.

### Turn it off and on again!

What do we do when our phone goes on the blink? What do we do when our television stops responding to the remote? Or when the computer locks



up? – We "turn it off and on again" and it usually fixes the problem.

Well strangely enough that's exactly what a defibrillator does. If you have a cardiac arrest or irregular rhythm and a defibrillator is used on you it provides an electrical shock that stops your heart and restarts it again so that it can naturally return to a normal rhythm.



When someone suffers a cardiac arrest, every minute's delay in restarting the heart results in a reduction of chances of survival. All villagers now have access, in minutes, to this vital life-saving equipment, the cabinet code is given by dialling 999 and requesting ambulance assistance.

### The Sky at night

From 16<sup>th</sup> 25<sup>th</sup> April – try looking for the **Lyrid meteor shower**.

This will be visible and will peak on 22 April. It's not the busiest of the yearly meteor showers, but can still thrill and dazzle. Around 22<sup>nd</sup> and morning of 23<sup>rd</sup> April the Moon will be below the



horizon until around 4 am BST, so won't cause light pollution, making it easier to see this occurrence.

The Lyrids are generated by debris from Comet C/1861 G1 Thatcher, which does a lap of the Sun once every 415 years. It's the oldest recorded meteor shower still visible today, and was first recorded in 687 BCE.

### 19th April – 28th May - The Eta Aquariid meteor shower

This is active, peaking between midnight and dawn on 5<sup>th</sup> May with possibly 40 meteors per hour.

You'd get a better view in the Southern Hemisphere and it will appear low in the sky in the Northern Hemisphere in the early hours, before dawn. Nevertheless, it should still be possible to see the shower in the eastern sky even when the radiant is below the horizon.

The source of the meteor shower is the famous Halley's Comet, which is visible from Earth about every 75-76 years.

### A Report from Wiltshire and Community Messaging

The third iteration of Operation Ragwort, led by Wiltshire Police, took place on Monday 3 and Tuesday 4 March across two of Wiltshire's major road networks, the A303 and the A419. Over the two days, officers from Wiltshire Police were joined by over 60 police officers and staff from Avon & Somerset Police, Devon & Cornwall Police, Dorset Police, Gloucestershire Constabulary, and Thames Valley Police, as well as partner agencies including vehicle examiners from the National Rural Crime Unit and Environment Agency officers.

Operation Ragwort is a joint initiative between the five police forces in the South West region, and the Police and Crime Commissioners for all five forces. The aim of this operation was to stop and check all vehicles towing trailers carrying quad bikes, livestock, agricultural equipment, and plant along two key Wiltshire Road networks, to prevent and disrupt the transportation of stolen machinery. This follows intelligence from Wiltshire Police which suggests the theft of agricultural machinery, plant machinery, horseboxes and farming tools has increased by 3% from 2023 to 2024. Over the two days of action, over 100 vehicles were stopped and checked. Two vehicles were seized, a suspected stolen trailer was recovered, and a vehicle prohibition was completed on a vehicle carrying a trailer containing a dangerous load. As a result of vehicle stops completed during the operation, the Environment Agency are following up on two cases of waste carrying breaches.

Superintendent James Brain, Rural Crime Tactical Lead for Wiltshire Police and Regional Rural Crime Lead, said: "The aim of Operation Ragwort is two-fold, to disrupt and deter the organised theft of agricultural machinery and plant across our county borders, and reassure our rural communities that Wiltshire Police is committed to tackling rural crime." He continued: "Wiltshire Police's message is simple – if you have been a victim of rural crime, including agricultural machinery theft, please come forward and report this to the police online or by calling 101. Reports of crime help build intelligence and enable the Force to target resources and dedicate future operations to specific locations. Rural crime is a nationally emerging threat, and Wiltshire Police are united with neighbouring police forces and partner agencies across the South West to prevent rural crimes from taking place."

### Update on Potholes and Speeding for Derry Hill & Studley

I thought it would be helpful to write and give an update on some of the common local issues that residents raise to me through e-mail or via doorstep conversations, particularly potholes and speeding traffic.

#### **Potholes**

With the extreme winter weather that we are having in the UK, more and more roads across the country need investment to keep them maintained to a good standard and pothole free.

Significant extra funding for road maintenance has been put in the budget at Wiltshire Council and we have had some good success locally with the resurfacing of Church Road at the Lansdowne Arms end of Derry Hill as an example. Over the course of this winter, the other end of Church Road has deteriorated significantly and is now in need of repair. I have asked that Wiltshire Council undertake Bobcat patch repairs where clusters of potholes have opened up on Church Road as well as the large pothole that keeps reappearing on Old Derry Hill. The Bobcat machine is a better way of repairing potholes by cutting out a square section of the tarmac and then hot tarmac is used to fill the hole and the edges sealed, which results in a much more permanent repair. I am hopeful that these repairs will be undertaken over the next couple of months.

I drive our roads with the local highways engineer every few months and report potholes or other issues that need addressing, but if you do spot something that needs repair, either report it on the MyWilts app or let me know and I can report it on your behalf.

### Speeding

Speeding remains a concern in the new 40/50mph on the A4 as well as on Church Road through Derry Hill, on the A4 at Pewsham and on the A342 Devizes Road at Derry Hill and at Sandy Lane. I am pleased that we have been able to lower the speed limit on the A4 at Studley Crossroads, but some drivers are not adhering to the new limit.

I am regularly in contact with Wiltshire Police and have asked them to undertake additional enforcement at all these locations which they have started to do more frequently. Hopefully, this continued enforcement will make more drivers think about their speed when they are travelling on our local roads.

Speed indicator devices continue to be rotated around different locations which help with driver awareness of their speed. These devices are used in 20/30/40mph zones and now that the speed limit at Studley Crossroads has been reduced to 40mph, the parish council will be able to place the devices at the crossroads to help with managing speed compliance.

### THE VICARAGE

The 1-acre piece of land on Church Road was gifted by Angell of Rumsey House. The foundation stone for the vicarage was laid by Mr B J Angell esq in 1842. The vicarage was built in 1843.

The first vicar to move in was Rev Stafford Brown. In his diary, Rev Brown noted that life was very hard in 1830's Derry Hill and that he was determined to see Christ Church built and the light brought to those of the village. Rev Brown moved to Westbury, Wiltshire in 1845 –





replaced at Derry Hill by the Rev John Lowder. Rev Brown died two years later aged just 33.

The last vicar to live in the original vicarage was Rev Selwyn Swift (1983 to 1989). He was the 15th vicar of Derry Hill. Born in Yorkshire in 1941, Selwyn married Glenys Heys in 1966 in Hounslow. He was ordained in 1976. Selwyn passed away suddenly on 18th November 2012 aged 71 years - "And God shall wipe away all tears from our eyes".

In the 1980's the 1-acre plot was subdivided; the New Vicarage was built on half and the other half sold. Bethesda House was built in 1985/6.

Bethesda House was sold to a developer in 2024 and the building is to be converted to a number of independent apartments.





### **Book Club Review**

### Hillbilly Elegy, A memoir of a family and culture in crisis. By J D Vance

This book was chosen when Mr Vance was to be inaugurated as Vice President of America a position often described as a heartbeat away from the White House.

It is an autobiographical account of His life to the age of about 30 years. Mr Vance makes it clear that he identifies as a Hillbilly but the book reveals that his connection to this culture and way of life




is through ancestry rather than experience since his grandparents left their community as newly married teenagers. They worked hard in industrial Ohio to give themselves and their children a more comfortable lifestyle than the one they grew up in.

The use of Hillbilly slang and by constantly writing of the culture as his own, Mr Vance reinforces his right to speak for and about a community in which he has only ever been a visitor. The use of incidents which suggest a feckless and workshy way of life and extrapolating from them to generalities leads Mr Vance to suggest that state help is a wasteful use of public money. In doing so he fails to notice the plight of people in areas where paid employment is hard to come by and the absence of such aid must lead to greater misery.

His own rise from a difficult beginning as the son of an alcoholic mother, who provided him with a succession of stepfathers (6), to a graduate of Harvard law school via a four-year stint in the public relations department of the Marines in Iraq is an impressive achievement. But we felt the book reveals a lack of empathy for others less able to overcome adversity.

The overwhelming feeling of Book Club members was that the book presented a picture of JD Vance at variance with the person we saw at the recent White House press conference with Ukrainian President Zelenskyy.

According to Kew Gardens, over half the world's population of bluebells, or Hyacinthoides non-scripta, grow in the UK. They're native to Britain and other parts of Western Europe. But Britain is their citadel,


