

# **Rector's notes for June 2025**

This is a big month for the Marden Vale Benefice as we prepare to welcome Carly Taylor, the first training curate based here for over 20 years, to be ordained deacon in Salisbury Cathedral on Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> June. We have booked a coach, so please call Ann in the office if you'd like to book a place. Carly has prepared some Ember cards, to help us pray for her – these are available in church, and below Carly explains what they are all about.

#### Ember Cards - what are they and why are they shared?

Ember Days in the Church date back to the 4<sup>th</sup> century. These were days set apart to pray and fast for farming, and especially harvest. Over time the connection to agriculture has diminished, and Ember Days which occur in March, June, September and December are used to pray for people exploring new ministries in the church, whether lay or ordained.

Ember cards were probably first used to communicate news of a person's upcoming ordination, at a time when communication was less easy. Today Ember cards are sent out to friends, family, and parishioners, to ask for prayers in the time leading up to ordination.

For my card, I've chosen an image of the Beatitudes, by iconographer Kelly Latimore. The Beatitudes, recorded in

Matthew's gospel, are the words Jesus

proclaimed at the start of the Sermon on the Mount. We're given a glimpse into the heart of Jesus, of his compassion and love.

Jesus lived out the Beatitudes in who he chose to spend time with, who he called to be disciples, and in people he healed – often living on the margins of society.

Jesus' promise of blessings for all who are poor in spirit, meek, mourning, for the persecuted and for peacemakers, feels connected to some of the words the Bishop will speak in my ordination service, about being a deacon: 'They are to work with their fellow members in searching out the poor and weak, the sick and and lonely those who are oppressed and powerless. reaching into the forgotten corners of the world, that the love of God may be made visible.'

Please do pray for me in the weeks leading up to my ordination. As I become more

aware of what I am about to move into, I really value being held in prayer, knowing this calling is only possible in God's strength and not my own.

# Where Are our Defibs?

Continue, Enter your postcode or Derry Hill, Calne and you will see the location of the six defibs in Derry Hill and Studley. Click on each marker to see precise location, its ready status, and how to get there. Or check up on other locations you visit regularly.

#### Cardiac Arrest – 999 & CPR ASAP

If you see a person in cardiac arrest, call 999 immediately and start CPR. You will be told what to do by the 999 operator while you wait for an ambulance to arrive.

Time is critical and CPR is necessary to maintain an oxygen supply to the brain and other organs until the heart can be restarted by defibrillation shock.

You don't need to be qualified to do CPR or to use a defib, you are trying to save a life! Scan below and watch the video:

# The Sky at night

The summer solstice.

Here in the Northern Hemisphere, we will mark the summer solstice on 21<sup>st</sup> June, the 'longest day of the year', when there will be around 16.5 hours of daylight.



No doubt we will see photos of the celebrations at Stonehenge at this time! The exact moment of the solstice is at 3.42 am BST, which is the point at which the Northern Hemisphere is tilted farthest towards the Sun. From that point on, days will get progressively shorter until the winter solstice on 21<sup>st</sup> December

Look out for the moon on 11<sup>th</sup> June the so-called Strawberry Moon. This is because in North America, the harvesting of strawberries in June gives that month's full moon its name. However, Europeans have dubbed it the Rose moon, while other cultures named it the Hot moon for the beginning of the summer heat.



Another June date of interest is that on 22<sup>nd</sup> June 1675 King Charles II founded the Royal Observatory at Greenwich. The first Astronomer Royal, John Flamsteed, was to observe and record the positions of the stars in order to "find out the so-much-desired longitude of places".

It was this search for a way to measure longitude – a person's position east or west - which led to the world's first Prime Meridian, laying the foundations for Greenwich Mean Time and the global time system we still use today.

# Fetes!

The Derry Hill and Studley Fete will be on the 12<sup>th</sup> July this year. The fete has been a steady feature on the village diary – second Saturday in July. Looking back, there has been a strong history of fetes.



On August 20<sup>th</sup> 1868 the North Wilts Horticultural Society held its annual fete at Bowood. The newspaper of the day commented:

'The readiness with which Mrs Colston – and since her death, the family of that lady – have always thrown open Roundway Park for the holding of the annual Fete of the North Wilts Horticultural Society will not be forgotten by the inhabitants of Devizes; and it was from no want of appreciation past kindnesses that the locus in quo of the Society's fete was this year shifted a little further afield.

It seems to have been thought by those that who undertake the management of the Society's affairs that it would be well for once to vary the scene of the attraction and upon an invitation from the Marquis of Lansdowne that this year the show to be held in the beautiful park of Bowood.

It was for this reason that Bowood became the scene of this year's fete (1868). Everything that could be done was done to render the fete worthy of the occasion.

There was the magnificent band of the Grenadier Guards pouring forth Moore's Melodies with a sweetness which seems to bring back the features that joy used to wear. But besides the Guard's band there was our own county band of the Royal Wilts Militia, and the band attached to our local Volunteer Corps. All the music which delighted those that heard it.

On the day, just as every arrangement had been completed – when the tents were up, and the flowers arranged – and the bands ready to awaken the glades and the woods – down came the rain. Not a mere sprinkle but a regular downpour. It was about half past one when it began, and by this time a large number of carriages were on their way to the scene, filled with the fashion of the neighbourhood. Some 6 or 7,000 persons entered the enclosure around the house where the tents had been arranged and the bands stationed.

As the afternoon wore one various amusements were started – there was archery and Aunt Sally, and dancing and all sorts of fun. Fireworks had been announced for 9 pm in the evening, by which time Bowood was pretty well enveloped in darkness. The number of persons present had by this time considerably increased – it is computed that there could be 10,000 people present. The effect of the fireworks in the part was singularly grand – and when the 'grand finale' came with its terrific Vesuvian blaze terminating with the motto 'Prosperity to the Flower Show' the crowd cheered and cheered again.

The final consideration of the crowd was how to get home for the drives through the park were as dark as pitch, so dark that those without lamps had to grope their way along.

What a result of the fete, with receipts in excess of  $\pounds 205$  – noting in 1861 the fete made just  $\pounds 98$  and in 1862 (the year of the balloon ascent) they made  $\pounds 110$ .

Next time you visit the grounds in Bowood just imagine the scene with the band of the Grenadier Guards playing and 10,000 massed to see the grand finale of the fireworks.

# **Calne Neighbourhood Policing Update**

Crime and incident updates

- Between 26/04/2025 and 28/04/2025, unknown persons have entered a site and damaged several heavy plant machines.
- On 30/04/2025 at 16:54hrs, a road traffic collision occurred in /Beacon Hill, Hilmarton. The driver of the offending vehicle failed to stop at the scene. Damage caused to the reporting person's vehicle. Enquiries are ongoing.
- On 04/05/2025 at 17:00hrs, report of a vehicle travelling too fast around a sharp bend in Spirt Hill. Substantial damage caused to the reporting person's vehicle.
- On 10/05/2025 at 19:33hrs, two male youths have been seen to throw a brick from the Millennium Bridge over the A4 at Black dog Hill. The item narrowly missed a windscreen of a passing vehicle but has caused damage to the body work.
- On 09/05/2025 at 06:59hrs, officers attended an address in Church Road, Derry Hill where a male was arrested on suspicion of conspiracy to supply class A drugs. During a search a large amount of cash and drugs were located. Enquiries are currently ongoing.
- On 13/05/2025 at 16:48hrs, unknown persons have hung a flag which was reported to have anti-Jewish wording from Millennium Bridge over the A4 at Black Dog Hill. The flag was removed and seized by the attending officers.

#### Road safety

We are continuing to monitor any collisions or incidents on the A4 and surrounding routes of Derry Hill and will look to target those locations for preventive patrols and enforcement action where possible.



We are seeing a decrease in traffic on our rural roads due to the section of Dauncey, near Lyneham re-opening.

We will be paying particular attention to all routes including those in East Tytherton, Derry Hill, Bremhill and Foxham over coming weeks.

We have forwarded on reports of vehicles travelling at excessive speeds through the 20mph limit in the village of Derry Hill to our Roads Policing Unit, who will also be looking to target this area in the coming weeks.

The Calne Neighbourhood Team are fully committed to keeping our roads as safe as possible and we will continue to conduct speed checks throughout our area.


Councillor Ashley O Neill was re-elected to Wiltshire Council and we will continue to work closely with him to secure positive outcomes for the Parish.

# Walking Netball





# **Book Club Review**

Moondust – In Search of the Men Who Fell to Earth by Andrew Smith (originally published 2005)

As part of the Apollo Space Programme, between July 1969 and December 1972, twelve men walked on the Moon....where do you go after you've been to the Moon?

Over three decades after the first men walked on the Moon, in a chance encounter, journalist Andrew Smith met with Charlie Duke (the youngest 'Moonwalker', then 69). His realisation that only 9 were still alive and in the near future, there would be none, sets



him on a journey to find the remaining men and discover the answer to the question.

An original approach and an amazing story, we were all intrigued to read about the moonwalkers, fellow astronauts, families, and the Apollo programme. Particularly powerful was (re)learning about the politics and social history of the time, the tragic deaths of men killed during training that gave these men their chance, and the lack of financial reward and support for their extraordinary bravery and courage when they 'fell-back to Earth'. (Pay was their same army pay - \$8 a day, minus deductions for their free bed on the Apollo mission - Buzz Aldrin had a framed receipt which says: "From Houston to Cape Kennedy, Moon, Pacific Ocean. Amount claimed: \$33.31.")

At turning 40, American-born, UK-lived journalist, Smith's reflections on how they all made their mark around the age he is writing, his experiences of the moon landings and his relationship with his 'home' country, means the book becomes more of a vehicle for his own selfsearching and re-discovery of his native country.

On a personal note, I met Charlie Duke in 2008, and he was very kind when I asked if I could touch someone who had walked on the Moon! Back to the book: more moonwalkers, less author was our overall feeling.

Footnote 1: As at April 2025, four of America's moonwalkers are still alive: Buzz Aldrin (Apollo 11), David Scott (Apollo 15), Charles Duke (Apollo 16), and Harrison Schmitt (Apollo 17).

Footnote 2: Looking ahead, and almost 60 years later, the Artemis Programme is hoping to launch a 10 day, 4 crew lunar flyby mission in April 2026, followed by a lunar surface landing mission in mid-2027.







#### The world from our neighbours' windows

There's an old stone house on a hill that I can see from my back window. Today, that distant building is bathing in sunlight. It looks rather idyllic over there, surrounded as it is by rolling pastures.





