



Thought for February

Not since the days of the Cold War decades ago has the world seemed such an uncertain and troubling place. The degree of polarity, within Western nations at least, seems to be at worrying new levels.

I don't think there has ever been a greater need for people to decide to live according to different agenda – namely where principles of justice and peace, kindness, mercy, tolerance and love are valued more highly than individualism and personal gain.


Various homegroups in the parish are happening this Lent, looking at Difference – a course that explores what Christian faith has to say about living in a complex and divided world. How do we live well alongside people with whom we strongly disagree about various matters?

The course will run over five sessions, once per week, each one lasting 90 minutes and run in people's homes, at Church House and online. At the time of writing we haven't quite finalised the exact details, but look out for more information on the weekly notice sheet. The first sessions will be in the week beginning 23rd February. Each session includes a video clip of people from nations around the world who have faced conflict, division or a difficult relationship.

Subjects include:

- How can faith transform relationships in a conflicted world

- Confronting our own differences and prejudices
- Navigating disagreements, and how they can become an opportunity for stronger relationships
- Practising forgiveness: recognising the mess and complexity of putting this into practice in our relationships
- Risking hope: doing relationships God's way can be risky and resisted, but the hope it brings is transformative



I've long been an advocate for talking about matters of faith in a smaller group being one of the most effective ways to strengthen our faith. Sunday services, we hope, can be uplifting, but we don't really invite heckling in sermons, so they aren't really places for faith conversations. Conversely a small group is exactly the place to ask honest questions, and listen to other people's wisdom and experience. Why not give it a go this Lent?

ordained in Salisbury Cathedral and then go on to serve as a curate somewhere else in the diocese. In fact the pathway of Gareth's training is the same as our curate Carly took, though hers was based at Canterbury.

So for the next 18 months, Gareth will be popping up in our various churches, experiencing church life and ministry with us. He'll be with us most Sundays, and usually one other day per week.

News from the Tower

You may have heard the bells of St Mary's ringing during December and wondered what was going on. The simple answer is that we have been broadcasting the news of celebrations for Christmas and the start of a New Year. The celebrations at St Mary's started with the St Mary's School Carol Service on 7th December, then it really got going on 21st of December with the service of Carols by Candlelight. On 21st we also went to Compton Bassett to ring their bells for their carol service; there are no local bellringers at Compton Bassett so we help out when we can. On Christmas Eve we were very busy – 2.45pm at Yatesbury (again, no local ringers), 3.30pm at St Mary's for the Crib Service, 8.20pm at Bremhill, where some of their local ringers were unavailable and again at St Mary's at 10.30pm for the 'midnight' first communion of Christmas. Back again on Christmas Day morning to celebrate before the Christmas morning eucharist.

Between Christmas and New Year we had some visiting bellringers. On New Year's Eve we met at St Mary's Tower at



11.40pm to ring the old year out, then at midnight the tenor struck 12 blows to mark the hour and we all joined in to celebrate the New Year, surrounded by fireworks outside. The later was accompanied by mulled wine and prosecco!

As January begins we are back to our normal pattern of ringing on Friday evenings for practice and on Sunday mornings for service. What is Intangible Cultural Heritage?

Intangible Cultural Heritage (ICH) refers to living traditions, knowledge, skills, and expressions passed down through generations, including oral histories, performing arts, social rituals, traditional crafts, and understanding nature, providing identity, continuity, and fostering respect for diversity, as recognized and safeguarded by UNESCO. It's a dynamic, living heritage that

adapts as communities practice and recreate it, linking past to present.

Why does it matter? One example is traditional evensong. Another is Pancake Day. UNESCO's 2003 Convention provides a framework for nations to protect ICH. The UK Government has signed up to this convention and it will help to protect and maintain our British heritage.
