GARDENING STEVE

Hi to all you gardeners.

March is a month when you should see improving weather; the days start to get longer and hopefully warmer and we can forget the cold winter and look forward to Spring. There is still time to prune all your bush and shrub roses; I have just finished pruning the 600 roses on the lower terrace.



When you prune the roses try and cut out all the old and dead wood, cutting down to 3ft from the ground. You could leave them a bit higher if you wish depending on how tall the roses grow. When clearing up try and remove all the leaves from the roses and the ground as this will stop the spread of black spot. Give the roses a good handful of rose fertilizer then mulch them with horse manure. This will get them off to a good start.

When it's a good sunny day, try giving the lawn its first cut but not too low and then you could even scarify and feed the lawn. When the weather gets a little warmer, and the sun gets stronger, ventilate the greenhouse a little. Plant your onion sets and prepare the seedbeds ready for all your sowings of vegetables. Let's hope we have a good Spring.

COMMUNITY POLICE REPORT

Once again, I am happy to report a reduction in crime on our rural area for the Month of December and January.

Although numbers of reported crimes are down, please remain vigilant and consider extra security measures wherever possible. Make life as difficult as possible for thieves, so that they don't want to return to our villages.

Anything you see that you are not happy with – please call us. Take any registration numbers and we can check them out.



Rogue Traders Warning:

This week we have received several reports of Rogue Traders targeting locations in Calne by way of letter dropping properties with flyers advertising to do general household maintenance work.

On the evening of **30/01/2015** an elderly Calne resident was taken to a local cash machine where a large amount of cash was withdrawn, which we believe was in relation to a very small amount of work, which had been completed at his property.

Although an incident of this nature is extremely rare in Calne, it does happen, and we are urging anyone with elderly parents or relatives to be mindful of their home security and anyone approaching their properties offering to do work for them, or paying them any unwanted attention.

We are also asking members of the Community to report anyone they see behaving in a suspicious nature on **101** or **999** if a crime is in progress.

If you are able to take note of vehicle registrations, number of persons and descriptions, these would be of great assistance to us in trying to identify suspects.

With the agreement of the client, appropriate devices are installed to secure the property. Time is spent offering reassurance and advice on how to protect the house against crime and fire risks. Their operators drive Police marked vehicles and dress as Police Support Staff.

SOUNDS GREAT!



FULKE FITZWARINE AND KING JOHN



Walk down Studley Lane and turn left going past Studley Corner in the direction of Stanley. At the top of the hill look across the fields to the right: there once stood one of the finest Cistercian Abbeys. And here in **1201** King John laid siege to try to capture his enemy.

John 'The Bad' ('Lackland') had a troubled reign, culminating in the loss of his French duchies and a Barons War and his having to accept

Magna Carta, on which is based the very foundation of Western democracy and just government.

The origin of this specific conflict however goes back to his childhood, when even then John was exhibiting many of the worst traits of that famous Angevin character when he was playing chess with his friend Fouke or Fulke Fitzwarin (a scion of one of the fiercest and proudest of the Norman families), who checkmated him. In a temper Prince John snatched up the chessboard, and struck Fouke who returned the assault with such vigour that John fell against the wall, struck his head, and lay senseless. As soon as he recovered he ran sobbing to his father, King Henry II (the founder of many just laws), who told him he richly deserved what he had got; sent for his tutor, and ordered John to be flogged.

John bore grudges, was venal, vain, intemperate, and overbearingly proud so never forgot the affront. When he was King, he seized Fulke's estates. Fulke armed his followers, and aided by other barons (who smarted under John's tyranny) carried on a petty warfare against the Sovereign. His adventures and escapes in many a county of England would make a long tale.

Once in North Wilts, when in ambush in Braden Forest, news reached him of the approach of a party of merchants bearing rich cloths and other valuable goods purchased in foreign parts for the King and Queen. Fitzwarine pounced on them, and divided the costly brocades, silks, and ermines among his soldiers then released the merchants, and sent his compliments to their Majesties for their acceptable present.

John, outraged, was soon on his track, and hunted him from place to place till in his desperate necessity, he ran to sanctuary in Stanley Abbey.

"*Here he was besieged,*" (says a Latin MS. in the Bodleian) "*for fourteen days*". But came out safe in the peace

of the Church, and was reconciled to John in the following year, **1202** and pardoned in November **1203**.

He recovered Whittington and all his lands and remained in the king's peace until joining the baronial rebellion in support of Magna Carta in **1215**. He was not reconciled to the king until **1217**, and died c.**1256-7**.

With Hereward the Wake, Eustache the Monk, Robin Hood and Fouke le Fitz Waryn, we have the form of the English outlaw romance in which the heroes' adventures represent a mixture of history, legend, and myth. They give us one of our greatest archetypes: the English hero fighting for justice against tyrannical governance.




CALNE WITHOUT PARISH COUNCIL NEWS




For Derry Hill, March 1955.....

PEAR AND GINGER UPSIDE-DOWN CAKE

175g (6oz)	Golden syrup
4-6	Ripe-ish pears, peeled, halved with the core removed
100g (4oz)	Butter, soft
100g (4oz)	Caster sugar
2	Eggs, beaten
100g (4oz)	Self-raising flour, sifted
Between half and two teaspoons, (whatever you fancy!)	Ground ginger



Preheat the oven **160°C, 325°F, GM3**. Line a **6inch** round tin.

Beat the butter and sugar together until light and fluffy, add in the Golden Syrup then the eggs one at a time adding a little flour after each egg, then add the rest of the flour and ginger and beat well. I'm partial to ginger so I usually put in a good heaped tea spoon but add as much or as little as you like, it works equally well with cinnamon.

Lay the pear halves flat side down in the prepared tin. Pour in the cake mixture making sure the pears are covered.

Pop into oven for about **45** minutes, it could take less, possibly more depending on the size of the pears so just keep checking it.

Remove from oven and either serve warm with custard (quite delicious) or wait until cooled and enjoy with your afternoon cuppa....smug in the knowledge you're eating one of your five a day!

I'd mastered it when I was five.....



The Miniaturist by Jessie Burton.

On an autumn day in 1686, eighteen-year-old Nella Oortman knocks at the door of a grand house in the wealthiest quarter of Amsterdam. She has come from the country to begin a new life as the wife of illustrious merchant trader Johannes Brandt, but instead she is met by his sharp-tongued sister, Marin. Only later does Johannes appear and present her with an extraordinary wedding gift: a cabinet-sized replica of their home. It is to be furnished by an elusive miniaturist, whose tiny creations mirror their real-life counterparts in unexpected ways. Nella is at first mystified by the closed world of



the Brandt household, but as she uncovers its secrets she realizes the escalating dangers that await them all. *The Miniaturist* is a story of love and obsession, betrayal and retribution, appearance and truth. A thoroughly enjoyable read, full of twists and turns as secrets upon secrets are revealed. By Christine Acford.
