FUNDING FOR YOUR COMMUNITY PROJECT

Following their installation of the 9MW solar farm at High Penn on the edge of Calne, Sun Edison has donated a community benefit fund to Calne Without Parish Council. Ed Jones, Chairman of the Parish Council, said *"We are very grateful to Sun Edison for donating this fund. We are keen for the fund to directly benefit the residents of Calne Without, so we are appealing to local groups to come forward and request funding"*.

The Parish Council has drawn up a list of criteria that must be met in order to be considered for a donation. The overall theme is to enhance our environment and our use of it. Within those parameters the opportunities are wide ranging. A village group might want to plant some trees or establish a wildflower meadow; improve an outside play or community area; restore a foot or cycle path; or it could be a contribution to a renewable energy project on a community building.

GARDENING STEVE



Plants should be growing now in the garden. While I am writing this we have been enjoying some really warm and settled weather. Even the swallows have returned from their winter migration in Africa. Keep up regular feeding on all houseplants usually once a week. After the spring flowers have died down get the ground ready for the summer bedding. These can go in around the end of May when the danger of frost has passed. You can now plant up your hanging baskets and keep them in the greenhouse until they are established. The roses should now be really growing, keep spraying fortnightly. If you see any sign of black spot remove the leaf and spray; if you don't it will soon spread. Stake your herbaceous borders before they get too tall. Keep up the good work in your gardens because it's now you can see all your hard work you did in the winter rewarding you with colour and healthy plants. See you in July. Happy gardening!



COMMUNITY POLICE REPORT

Speed Enforcement

Our speed checks in the rural areas continue.

On **28th April, 2015** we attended East Tytherton where a check was completed at the **30mph** limit. Seven drivers were given verbal warnings for driving slightly over the limit. Two were issued with **£100** Fixed Penalty notices for travelling at **43** and **52** mph. This offence carries three penalty points on a driving licence.



Compton Bassett drivers received five warnings for driving slightly over the speed limit in the **30mph** limit.

Headington was also checked with a zero result.

A driver was stopped at Cherhill in the **40mph** limit driving at **57mph**. He did not have a valid driving licence. His punishment at court is a **£200** fine, and a six-month disqualification.

Rural Crime

Overnight on **1-3rd May** a burglary took place at Quemerford Gate and a further burglary at Ratford overnight on **6th May**.

During the afternoon of **6th May**, a child's Nemesis bike was ridden off by a male who took it from a private garage.

Sandy Lane saw the theft of garden furniture including a Char-broil gas grill BBQ.

At Cherhill White Horse lay by, a handbag and contents were stolen from a parked car during the afternoon of **11th May**.

Please be mindful that the rural areas of Wiltshire are currently suffering a spate of thefts and burglaries. Please try to put extra security on outer buildings. The burglaries shown here have all occurred in outer buildings. Outside lights are always a good deterrent.

OUR FEATHERED AERIAL ACROBATS



I must admit to having been impatient this spring. The old saying “*One Swallow doesn't make a summer*” is certainly true. I kept looking at the skies, but they were a little late arriving - apparently blown off course and thus delayed by the high winds we had.

Small wonder: it's a long way from South Africa where they over-winter to come back year after year to the same locality (and the same nests).

They are now firmly arrived in our villages I am relieved to say. They especially seem to like the skies between the A4 and all the way down Studley Lane and across in the direction of Derry Hill also. Feeding on the wing and when they have young they need to catch 6,000 insects a day! They have developed a slender, streamlined body and long pointed wings, which allow great manoeuvrability and endurance, as well as frequent periods of gliding. Their body shape allows for very efficient flight, which costs 50–75% less for swallows than equivalent passerines of the same size. All manner of insects appeal to them. If you have a pond you may well find them (as I do) swooping low across your garden. Such a delight!

They lay their eggs between May and August and often produce two or three broods. The last being tricky to ensure the young are fattened up and agile enough for the long journey south. The little ones leave the nest **18-21** days after hatching, and both parents feed them. First year breeders like to build a nest close to where they were born and raised.

They have been hit badly by modern farming practice: insecticides and modernisation of old farm building where they like to nest. They prefer ledges and rafters of building and both male and female build their saucer/cup shaped nest of mud and grasses lined with feathers.

It was once thought that they would hibernate in the mud at the bottom of pools and ponds and lakes and so they became associated with resurrection. In Christian mythology they were thought to have tried to stop the Crucifixion by taking away the soldiers nails! And in an interpretation of a passage from the Book of Jeremiah the swallow announces spring and Christ's Incarnation.

You will sometimes find swallows sitting on wires chattering away. I could watch them for hours- they are such a joy to behold especially when they fly in pairs like fighter jets dancing with immense agility.

Come late summer they will start to gather in great numbers. You will see them en masse sitting on the wires in the fields behind Studley Lane. Last year I had about **20** or so sitting on the wire in my garden. By October sadly they have all migrated south, and we know the season truly has changed. But for now they are here, so sit down and relax now and then and look up to the skies and watch our feathered aerial acrobats!

KINGSTON HOUSE



The Parish Council met on **May 11th 2015**.

The retiring Chairman Ed Jones was re-elected unanimously. The vacant position of deputy-Chairman was filled by Kate Morely, again elected unanimously.

There was discussion on the public response, including feedback from



Youth Club, to the proposed renewal or removal of the goalposts in Petty Acre. Councillors were delighted with the response, which was overwhelming in favour of the posts being replaced. It was agreed that the council should work towards replacement by the Summer holidays and in such a way that the new posts were put up as soon as the old ones were removed.

Details on the Sun Edison grants for Community Projects in Calne Without were further discussed. (Further information is in this magazine and on the council's website).

Progress on the Neighbourhood Plan was described as good with publicity going out to landowners not already registered. This will enable the Steering Group to assess available development land in the area.

The council will meet again on **1st June 2015 - 7.30pm** at the **New Meeting Room, Lansdowne Hall, Derry Hill**. Members of the public are welcome to come along.



ARTICLE FROM THE PAST




For Derry Hill, June 1955.....

May I express my grateful thanks to all who gave so generously at Easter. This year the offering really does go to the Vicar, and is not deducted from the grant which raises the stipend to a minimum. It came to the magnificent sum of fifteen guineas. At Evensong on Trinity Sunday the Vicar of Hilmarton, Rev. K. S. Rich, will be conducting the service and preaching whilst I shall be officiating at Hilmarton. It was most unfortunate that the date of the General Election clashed with the date already fixed for the Wilts

Archdeaconry Mothers' Union Festival Service at Salisbury Cathedral and so meant the cancelling of the event. Lady Walter Harvey is hoping that a fresh date, not too late in the year, will be made available for what is a great occasion for the Mothers' Union.

We hope to start work on the walls of the church in the near future. Can we depend on you for voluntary help, men to work on the ladders and trestles and women to wipe up the mess we make? For several years I have felt that we need a cosy place where smaller groups could meet and leave their belongings around. A scheme for raising the walls and roof of my garage and lowering the floor of the loft has been planned. This would give us a lovely room, 25ft. by 15ft., with access by an outside staircase. There would be cupboards and a fireplace and facilities for many activities commonly placed under the heading handicrafts. There are sufficient enthusiastic amateurs in the parish to do the job with voluntary labour. Much of the necessary materials has already been offered. In due course these plans will be presented for your consideration and support.

GINGER FLAPJACK

Flapjack

175g (6oz) Butter
25g (1oz) Golden syrup
100g (4oz) Sugar (light soft
brown preferable)
275g (10oz) Porridge oats
1 tspn Ground ginger

Topping

175-225g (6-8oz) Icing sugar, sifted
1 tspn Ground ginger
1-2 tblsp Cold water

Method

Preheat oven at **180°C, 350°F, GM 4**

Grease a **7x11 inch** shallow edge square or rectangular tin.

Melt the butter, syrup and sugar together. When melted stir in the oats and ginger. Mix well.

Turn into the prepared tin and level the top. Pop into oven for **20** minutes, until golden & firm. Remove from oven & leave to cool in the tin.

When cold make the topping. Mix together the icing sugar, ginger & water, pour over the flapjack. Leave to set & cut into pieces.

My recipe says smooth the topping over but I'm more of a 'drop in blobs from a great height' kinda girl, so I rather liked the random-ness of my icing...please do what you fancy. If you want another element to the flap jack you can reduce the oats by **50g** and replace with shredded coconut. I've also omitted the ginger in the topping and replaced with lemon juice which gives it a nice zingy kick with the flapjack. Happy Baking!



BOOK CLUB REVIEW

The Tale of Murasaki by Liza Dalby



Liza Dalby is an anthropologist specialising in Japanese culture and the only Westerner to have become a Geisha. She was a consultant to the Steven Spielberg film 'Memoirs of a Geisha'.

This novel is built from the historical fragments of the diary and poetry or 'waka' (a precursor to haiku) of the Lady Murasaki Shikibu; an 11th century courtier in Japan. Murasaki was herself the author of Tales of Genji, possibly one of the first novels ever written.

Liza Dalby tells the story of Murasaki and her life at the imperial court with all the daily detail and etiquette as she is required by the regent Michinaga to write her stories about Genji, with all his heroic exploits and love affairs. Interspersed with her 'waka' the reader can almost believe that the poems were an 11th century form of 'Twitter'!

To anyone with a thirst for Japanese history, although it lacks the highs and lows of Memoirs of a Geisha, Liza Dalby portrays a colourful image of life for a Japanese woman in this era.

Book Club verdict: liked, loathed, loved and interesting!

The next book to be reviewed is 'Headlong' by Michael Frayn.
