## GARDENING STEVE


Hi there! At the moment we are all enjoying some really lovely sunny and settled weather. Now is an ideal time to be harvesting from your garden not only fruit and vegetables but also cut flowers and herbs. Continue to deadhead your roses. Then give them a good feed of rose food and water, this will get them on their way to give you some



more blooms in the late summer. Keep up the spraying of pests on fortnightly intervals. Trim your box and privet hedges. Your containers and hanging baskets should be giving wonderful colour; keep up the watering and feeding – it's best to feed weekly. I suggest feeding with Chempak no 4, it is good and gives lots of big blooms. On your climbing roses train in any young or extended shoots ready for next year's prune. Now is the time to prune Wisterias; cut this season's growth back to 6 buds and tie in any you want to grow higher. Pyracanthas can also be trimmed to allow more sun to reach the berries. Hope you spend some time sitting in your garden and enjoying your hard work! See you all next month. Happy gardening! *Stephen Starr* - Bowood Gardener



# COMMUNITY POLICE REPORT



## Rural Crime

A farm at Hilmarton was the victim of a burglary to an outer shed between 18th and 22nd May, where a Mountain bike and socket set along with other items were stolen.

Overnight on 20/21st May, two properties in Derry Hill were burgled overnight and both lost

garden equipment including strimmers, mowers, a chainsaw, a bicycle and a wood-chipper.

June saw the Telephone kiosk cash box at Compton Bassett drilled by unknown offenders.

Copper cabling and scrap metal has been stolen from a property at Blacklands.

On 12th June a vehicle was parked at Blacklands on an unclassified road between the A4 and A361 and a handbag left inside it stolen.

## Speed Enforcement

Once again we try to keep the speeds down in our Rural areas and on 12th June a day's speed checks were completed at the following locations. I'll share the results with you:

**East Tytherton:** One endorsable ticket issued along with 3 penalty points to a driver who ignored the 30mph limit, in driving at 42 mph. 5 drivers were stopped and offered words of advice for driving slightly over the limit.

**Cherhill:** Nine endorsable tickets were issued to drivers for excess speed ranging from 52 to 65 mph and each carry the obligatory three penalty points. Words of Advice were given to seven other drivers.

# DEFIBRILLATOR NEWS



We would like to remind everybody that if you come across a casualty who might need a defibrillator the first thing you must do is **DIAL 999**. Then you will be in touch with the experts who will tell you exactly what to do and who will tell you the door code to remove the defibrillator from the cabinet if they think it is needed. Also just to remind everybody the defibrillators in **Derry Hill**

and **Studley** are all in haversacks with the accessories you might need, for ease of carrying. So just grab the bag and go.

You will be interested to know that our defibrillators have been called for three times since Christmas by the Ambulance Service. They were not actually used in these cases but were available if they had been needed. We would like to ask everybody to let us know when this happens so that we can check that everything is back in the bag okay and keep a record. If a defibrillator is actually used the Ambulance Service will notify us anyway. Thank you in advance for that.





# CALNE WITHOUT PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

*(Derry Hill and Studley are a part of the Calne Without Parish)*

The Parish Council met on June 1st.

The Council heard a presentation by David Gilmore and John Skinner on the Calne Culture and Tourism Group, which is hoping to expand the number of visits made to the area by tourists. They are now working with towns such as Marlborough and Chippenham to make an A4 Tourist Corridor.



The responses by the public to the Petty Acre goal post issue have been very strongly in favour of replacement. The Council agreed to fund new ones and their installation as soon as possible. Lord Lansdowne kindly offered to supply the topsoil necessary to fill in the depressions in the current goalmouths. There were a number of responses that also mentioned play facilities for children in Petty Acre. These responders will be contacted to further explore this idea.

The council decided to award the first tranche of money from the Solar panel fund to Derry Hill School to help pay for PV panels on the school. Further details of this fund are on the Parish Council's website. (See below).

The council will meet again on **6th July 2015 - 7.30pm** in the New Meeting Room, **Lansdowne Hall, Derry Hill**. Members of the public are welcome to come along.


# GLUTEN FREE FRUIT JAM BAKEWELLS

## For the Pastry

- 225g (8oz)** SR gluten free flour. Plus some for dusting
- 115g (4oz)** Butter, cut into squares
- 2 tbsp** Icing Sugar
- 1 tsp** Almond Flavouring/extract
- 1** Egg yolk
- 2-3 tbsp** Cold water

Rub together the flour and butter until it looks like breadcrumbs. Add the icing sugar, extract, egg yolk and enough of the water to make a soft dough. Cover with cling film and pop in the fridge for **15** minutes. Dust your surface with flour and roll out the pastry. I rolled it to about **5mm**. I used a normal sized cake tin and lightly greased the tin before I put the pastry in. Once the pastry is in the cases, prick them and pop them back into the fridge for another **15** minutes.

## For the Topping



- 115g (4oz)** Butter
- 115g** Caster Sugar
- 115g** Ground Almonds
- 3** Eggs, beaten
- ½ tsp** Almond Extract

Raspberry (or your favourite!) Jam, Flaked Almonds

Beat together the sugar and butter until light and fluffy, then add the almonds, egg and extract until it's combined. Remove the pastry from the fridge. Pop a little jam in the bottom of each pastry case. I used about a teaspoon in each. Cover each jam layer with the topping, make sure you cover all the jam so it doesn't bubble out over the tops. Sprinkle with flaked almonds. Makes about **18** or **20**.

Cook for **10** minutes at **200°C/400°F GM6** then reduce the temperature to **180°C/350°F/GM4** for about **15** minutes. Watch!

So, this is a bit of a '*make it up as you go along recipe*'. You could use plain flour but I didn't have any but the SR gluten-free worked just as well. It's a bit more crumbly a mixture but you just have to handle it more carefully. They were a hit at the Church BBQ so I hope you enjoy them too!

Dave decided to broaden my education last week and took me to see '*white ball cricket*' at Trent Bridge. England versus New Zealand - **50** overs each. It was a One Day International, the fourth between the two teams in a set of five. Up to that day New Zealand was leading **2-1**. To lose this match meant that England would have lost the series, so a lot was riding on the outcome.

I went along rather apprehensively, having never been to a cricket match before. I had done no more than glance at it on the television screen. 



The map of 1883 (Daniels map of 1773 is similar) shows part of the Common divided in seven strips of land, possibly village shares or allotments, again not unusual for this concept still formed part of the old English common farming system. By that time also large horticultural allotments had become established all over the area.



So next time you go for a walk down Studley Lane just let your mind's eye wander nostalgically to the days of yore when all that land between it and the field alongside Close Wood was the communal land of the old village. What would our ancestors make of it all now?



## FUNDING FOR YOUR COMMUNITY PROJECT



Just a reminder that the Parish Council has drawn up a list of criteria that must be met in order to be considered for a donation. The overall theme is to enhance our environment and our use of it. Within those parameters the opportunities are wide ranging. A village group might want to plant some trees or establish a wildflower meadow; improve an outside play or community area; restore a foot or cycle path; or it could be a contribution to a renewable energy project on a community building. At their meeting in June the Parish Council decided the **closing date** of the **first two rounds** would be **31st July** and **31st December**.
