RAGWORT

Every once in a while people get nudged into a state of panic over some issue or other, usually exacerbated by the media with wild claims. One such is “ragwort” (*Jacobaea vulgaris*/*Senecio jacobaea*) about which there is much false science, hysteria and frankly idiocy. So here is a brief factual guide.



1. “**It kills horses**”: Horses, sheep, cattle have been grazing alongside Ragwort for hundreds of thousands of years. In its live state they will not eat it. The only danger of poisoning is if:
 - i. it inadvertently gets mown and put into hay- where it becomes tasteless;
 - ii. if horses are actually starving they might be tempted, but probably not. (huge quantities are needed for fatality).
2. “**It will invade our gardens**”: Lots of things (nettles, weeds, wild flowers) could take over our gardens if we let it. But we cope: that is what we gardeners do. Weeding and control whilst ensuring a wide diversity and balance. Besides which the rate of spread is far less than hysteria suggests (as DEFRA has shown). It is a successful coloniser true, but so are many things – buddleia and rhododendron among them.
3. “**It is dangerous notifiable invader**”: There is no legal obligation to control or destroy it or notify anyone. But as with any weed etc landowners/gardeners should keep it under some sort of control/balance.

Now the good news: it is a **native wildflower** and a normal part of the British countryside. And **over thirty species of moth and butterfly feed on ragwort alone** - and of these seven are officially scarce. Many species would dramatically decline without it and some such as the Cinnabar Moth is totally dependent on ragwort for its survival (eating ragwort makes them distasteful to predators). In some countries the moth is used as a natural ragwort controller. **77** species of insect use it as both home and food, and **117** further species use it as a nectar source.

I always have a couple of clumps of it growing in my garden. I just take care to dead-head after flowering so I don't have too many popping up next year, as I do with many things. So let's enjoy that beautifully bright yellow Ragwort as a natural part of the rich panoply of our local Nature.

PENSION JARGON

Wiltshire Citizens Advice clears up pension jargon baffling consumers.

“**Flexi-access drawdown**”, “**open market option**” and “**safeguarded benefits**” are some of the pension terms most confusing for consumers, reveals **Wiltshire Citizens Advice**.

The local charity, which delivers face to face **Pension Wise** appointments in Wiltshire, South Gloucestershire, Bristol and Bath says people would find it easier to understand their pensions if the industry used simple, standard language to describe their products.



Some people are also unclear about terms which appear to be more straightforward, putting them at risk of missing out on the best pension options for them. For example; staff have reported cases where consumers wrongly believed that their ‘**selected retirement date**’ was set in stone as the date they could access their pension, when in fact they could have accessed their savings ahead of this date.

To help people get to grips with their pension, **Pension Wise** guiders have identified the pensions jargon which people find most perplexing and have explained them in simple terms.

Recent research from national Citizens Advice shows more than a quarter of people with defined contribution pensions feel that they don’t understand their pension plan, while fewer than one in five feel very confident.

Albert Ball, **Pension Wise** Project Manager said: “***Pension decisions can be hard enough without having to translate tricky wording. Many people coming to visit us are mystified by the jargon being used and our staff are here to help clear up the confusing language. Having a better understanding of what the terms mean puts consumers on a better path to choosing a retirement option which suits them.***”




CLEAN FOR THE QUEEN - 5TH MARCH

FLORENTINE SLICE

4 x 100g	Bars of Dark Chocolate
300g	Mixed dried fruit
½	Tub of Glace Cherries, halved
100g	Shredded Coconut
50g	Butter, melted
2	Eggs, beaten



Line an **8" x 11"** tin with foil. Melt the chocolate and spread evenly over the base of the tin. Pop in the fridge and leave to set. Preheat oven to **180°C, 350°F, GM 4**. In a bowl mix the dried fruit, cherries and coconut together, then add the melted butter and beaten egg. Mix well.

When the chocolate is set pour on the fruit mixture and spread evenly over the top, covering all the chocolate. Bake in the oven for about **25** minutes, until golden brown. When cool pop back into the fridge to set. Turn out of the tin and cut into fingers.

This is such a great recipe, it's another one of those recipes that can be adapted to suit your taste. Add some nuts or apricot pieces... anything really! It's also gluten free!

I keep it in the fridge after I make it so it stays solid, though I have served it with the chocolate barely set and it's really delicious... I dare you to eat more than one slice!!

GARDENING STEVE

Hi, Spring has sprung. The buds are now appearing on many shrubs and trees and the birds are singing happily at the dawn chorus. The migrating birds should be appearing soon. The warmth and the spring rains will now bring on huge increases of slugs and snails which can deal a lot of damage to plants. Spread slug pellets down but there is no need to put down a lot. Feed



your shrubs and plants, especially container grown, with a balanced fertilizer because like humans they need nutrients to survive. Often people don't feed plants in containers often enough. They need to be fed at least once a month. Keep on mowing regularly now if you haven't done already. Give your lawn a scarify to get rid of all the thatch that has built up. This will get your lawn off to a good start. After that apply a lawn weed killer and feed.

Prune Forsythias and Chaenomeles. These two shrubs put on a terrific colour in the spring the method of pruning these is the same. When the flowers are over cut back the flowered shoots to two or three buds from the base - this will give growth for next year. Climbing and rambling roses should now be tied in, tie them horizontal as far as possible, this will enable them to give a good display of flower. Also keep tying in the new shoots of clematis as they grow.

CALNE WITHOUT PARISH COUNCIL

(Derry Hill and Studley are in this Parish)

There were two meetings last time the Parish council met (7th March); the Annual Meeting and the normal business meeting. The first is to receive a report from the Chairman on the past year's activities and to listen to any points from the public. When the floor was opened to the public there were questions on the lack of play equipment in the area of Derry Hill and Studley, the War Memorial and the Studley Hill road surface. Councillor Colin Bell explained that he was trying to form a committee of parents to look at the options for a play area for young ones and was keen to get going as the Parish Council did have some money available to go towards such a project. He also reported that he now had a volunteer for the maintenance of the War Memorial. Studley resident, Keith Robbins, brought up the repair that had recently been carried out on the road surface of Studley Hill. He pointed out that whilst the surface had been repaired the spring was still running down the road and this will have a detrimental effect if the temperature drops below freezing. The Chairman, Ed Jones, agreed and said despite several discussions with Highways they had ignored the spring and failed to culvert or divert it so that it didn't run across the road. Further lobbying will now be needed to resolve this.



Later on in the meeting it was noted that Highways had still failed to resolve the sinking roadway in Church Road despite several emails.

When the council discussed planning it was noted that two more applications for development in Calne had been passed – Land off Oxford Road and an additional one in Marden Farm. Wiltshire council felt they couldn't oppose these as they would probably lose at appeal (with subsequent costs being awarded against them). The reasons given for this were that Wiltshire cannot demonstrate a five year supply of deliverable housing sites in this northern area. This is primarily caused by the Chippenham Sites Plan not being passed yet by the inspector. The second reason is that the Neighbourhood Plan that is currently being developed is not sufficiently developed to influence this. Friends of Blount's Court should note these rather unsettling points.



BOOK CLUB REVIEW



As the Second World War rages, the Japanese Imperial Army enters Burma and the British rulers prepare to flee. But the human legacy of the British Empire is left behind in the shape of sixty-two Anglo-Burmese children, born to local women after affairs with foreign men. Being mixed race they are not acknowledged by either side and they are to be abandoned with no one to protect them. Their teacher, Grace Collins, a young Englishwoman, refuses to join the European evacuation and instead sets out to deliver the orphans to the safety of India. She faces impossible odds because between her and India lie one thousand miles of jungle, mountains, rivers and the

constant, unseen threat of the Japanese. With Japanese soldiers chasing them down, the groups chances of survival shrink - until they come across a herd of fifty-three elephants who, with their awesome strength and kindness, quickly become the orphans only hope of survival. Based on a true story, *Elephant Moon* is a tale of courage and compassion in the midst of brutality and destruction. A compelling story of survival, set in one of the lesser-known events of WWII.

For once at book group we all shared a very similar opinion on this book. There were some good dramatic and heart-warming moments in the story, despite the harrowing subject matter. We felt there wasn't enough depth given to the characters who came across as one dimensional. The story itself was pacy and gripping in parts, however, we felt that John Sweeney, an experienced journalist, could really have developed the story line and the characters further. An interesting read about the history of Burma during the Second World War.

REVEREND ANN WRITES

I hope you have all enjoyed the Easter break.

Francis the Donkey joined us at Kingston House and guided us back to Christ Church. We were fortunate that it stayed dry for our walk which included about forty people. Palm Sunday is the beginning of Holy Week and the following week was as intense as it always seems to be in the church. During Holy Week many Christians try to put themselves into Jesus place so that they can have some idea of what he endured for them. It is so easy to sanitise the events of Holy Week. However, much of what happened then goes on today in our daily lives too but not usually with the same physical consequences.

The consequences of vindictiveness and gossip are often emotional, a lowering of self-esteem, depression, instability – mainly for the victim.

Why do people think the excuse for believing bad of someone is ‘there is always a grain of truth’ in what has been said. The point I am making is that thinking the worst of people doesn’t seem to make the ‘victim’ or the ‘attacker’ feel any better. So, why do people do it? Why are people ready to believe bad things about somebody, even though they may know them. Why do they not assert positive views instead?

We are reminded during Holy Week of Jesus great sacrifice that rather than fight a losing battle of words, he said nothing – and went to the cross allowing those who felt they had more to gain by persecuting him and destroying his reputation to have their way – rather than have his words further manipulated against him.

Easter Day comes, the evil against Jesus is overwhelmed by God’s love. Jesus forgives his enemies and those that failed to voice their support for him. He moves on to a new beginning, he gives those who murdered him a new beginning, a second chance.

This is how it should be between countries, families, friends, organisations that compete with one another for whatever reason – jealousy, envy, pride and so on.

This Easter, if you are judging someone badly perhaps you could ask yourself if their context is the same as yours and ask yourself ‘why’ you have such negative thoughts about them. Perhaps you have never even met them?!

May the new life of Easter bring us all a fresh start and belief that we are working together for the greater good! *Ann*

ARTICLE FROM THE PAST

Hints for Women, April 1955

Monday's Washing

Care of Nylon. All domestic bleaches rot nylon. If by chance you upset a bottle on any type of nylon, i.e. stocking or fabric, minimise the damage by soaking the affected article immediately in water. Another point about nylon not generally known is that it will boil, providing the temperature is not raised above 400°F. (This is the melting point of nylon)

Tuesday's Sewing

Button-holes. Before working button-holes, cover hole with New Skin or

colourless nail varnish. Leave for a few seconds to dry, then you will have a firm edge to the button-hole. This is very helpful for nylon, voile and other materials which fray easily.

Wednesday's Nursing


In Hospital. Instead of taking whole oranges to a patient in hospital, especially if you are a daily visitor, try this method: At home peel and skin two oranges and put them into one of those small screw-top jars as used for honey, etc. The oranges will remain fresh and moist for quite a time and can be eaten at leisure without any effort on the patient's part and no linen will be spoilt by the orange juice.

Thursday's Cooking

Two tips. When making suet crust for puddings, mix with lukewarm water instead of cold. The result is much lighter and more digestible. When frying eggs, sprinkle a little cornflour or plain flour into the pan after putting in the fat. This will prevent the eggs from popping and splashing the hot fat.

Friday's Household

Clean Windows. When you have spring-cleaned your windows, give them a good rub over with some furniture cream. They will stay clean for a long time and you will not have so many flies on them.


