The cheery daffodils will continue to bring cheer, though soon to be replaced in our woodland areas and gardens. with drifts of bluebells. Incidentally, this month sees the 250th anniversary of the birth of



William Wordsworth whose poetic reference to the daffodil is so well known.

14 April, St Tiburtius Day, is traditionally the date to hear the first cuckoo of Spring as it returns from its sojourn in Africa. It is the male that we hear singing and their stay on our shores is brief as they return to Africa in mid-June, traditionally by St John's Day, 24 June – after all they have no offspring to look after! Let's hope that we get to hear the iconic call of these birds this year as their numbers continue to decline. Hedgehogs, also endangered, begin to reappear from hibernation this month, hungry and tired, and could do with some help as they seek water and food (but no milk) in the early days of Spring.



There are some interesting anniversaries this month – the Union Flag was officially adopted for the nation on 12 April 1606 and much more recently Apple released its first iPad on 3 April 2010. For beer lovers, the beverage went back on sale in 19

of 48 states of the US on 7 April 1933 prior to formal legislation at the end of that year after 13 dry years of prohibition – imagine the queues – probably bigger than the recent idiotic dash to stockpile toilet rolls!

Dartmoor and Cornish Hedgerows

As a child I often travelled with my father in his lorry all over the country. And I knew what part of the country I was in according to the material used in house building and also the architectural tradition: for example: Cotswold stone, Welsh slate, Devon and Cornish granite, half-timbering of the Welsh



Marches and so on. The same was also true of hedgerows. I can't speak of other parts of the country but the hedgerows of the South-West I have seen and grown to love.

Cornish Hedges

The Cornish hedge (also found in parts of Devon such as Dartmoor) is a free-standing bank of soil whose sides are reinforced with rocks. Others say it's a double-layered stone wall whose cavity and fissures are filled with earth. The stones involved are usually granite boulders and/or wedges of slate. The soil is a lovely magical mixture of silty clay, sandy loam and moorland peat in which the Duchy abounds.

They are like a strangely linear and perpendicular rock garden. Sometimes, they're given a helping hand, with conventional hedges planted atop them. More often than not, however, the furnishings are left to Nature- the hedges' crests and slopes being swiftly colonized by native species and garden escapes, indigenous and exotic cohering in casual plant communities, resulting in some of the greatest beauties of the Cornish landscape. As you drive across the landscape in spring and summer you are often greeted by a ribbon of colour as far as the eye can see from the flowers of these bank hedges.

Devon Hedges

Overall, Devon has over 33,000 miles of hedges, with over three-quarters of hedgebanks thought to be of at least medieval origin (AD 1150 – 1450). Around 20% of the UK's species-rich hedges occur within Devon.

Attention to Devon hedges as a feature worth investigating was raised by Clement Pike in the 1925 volume of the 'Transactions of the Devonshire Association'.

On Dartmoor there are many such similar boundaries as in Cornwall and overall are referred to with the general name o

f "reaves" which extend all across the Moor (more people lived on Dartmoor in the Bronze Age than live on it today!). They would have once formed clan divisions and livestock defences. On the higher moor both boulder bank, and stone wall and reeve are often met with. On lower ground, it changes more to high earth banks (a bit like the sunken lanes we see around our local landscape).

Due to the lack of woodland on the high moor, the hedge trees once provided a source of wood for poles, faggots, and bark. The bank hedge now also provides an efficient windbreak for crops and livestock, in addition, the hedges also control soil erosion and run-off during the wet, winter months. (and Dartmoor is a very wet place: its reservoirs provide the water supply of most of the towns and cities of the South West) Such bank hedges were built by firstly digging a trench, the soil from which would be piled up on the owner's side of the land into a mound of about 4 – 6ft high and 4ft wide. On top of this would be planted oak, ash, birch or hazel trees which as they grew would be coppiced and after 15 – 20 years of growth can provide wood for many purposes. They are also a home for beneficial insects that prey on crop pests.

The hedges banks of Devon and Cornwall are almost as sturdy as the walls of a fortress, and once inside such a field by a hedge bank you feel really enclosed and isolated. They are impenetrable. One can only wish that the many aspects of



our landscape, wildlife, and heritage could have been as impassive and indestructible as these hedgerows. We don't have anything quite so dramatic in North Wiltshire, but sunken lanes of sorts do exist. Perhaps we should embrace "guerrilla gardening" and sow flowers along our grass verges to bring back those old ribbons of joyous colours.

The Night Sky in April

This month gives us another supermoon to enjoy and this will be the brightest Full Moon of the year, some 30 percent brighter than the faintest Full Moon of 2020. It is the Paschal Full Moon and will be with us on 8 April. Such an event takes place when the date of the Full Moon coincides with the time when the Moon is at its closest point



to Earth in its monthly cycle (this time 357,000km). If conditions for viewing are not right, then May will also witness a supermoon.

It has dominated the evening sky for some time now, but Venus will be at its most brilliant during April hanging in the western sky until it sets around midnight. Its brilliance diminishes in May and it will become a morning object again during July. It reaches peak brilliance on 28 April. The planet provides a great image between 2 and 4 April as it passes through The Pleiades. At around 11.00 pm on 3 April it will appear a little fuzzy to the naked eye as it looks to be swamped by the small tightly grouped star cluster of the Seven Sisters (The Pleiades). Further, once you have identified this cluster in such a way, you will find it easier to locate it in the night sky in the future. They are easily found again on 25 April when they will be low in the north western sky at 21.30 to the right of the thin crescent moon. With no interference from moonlight, 21/22 April will see the maximum (15 per hour) of the Lyrid meteor shower. They are formed of the dusty debris of Comet Thatcher.



Bowood Gardener

Hi to you all.

April is upon us and Spring is here. After a very wet winter we hope now to have some dry days ahead of us.

Protect your plants from slugs; pellets are a good way of controlling them, there are a lot now that are harmless to pets. If you are an organic gardener, the oldest and best known is a beer trap. This is a jar sunk in the ground with the top just proud of the surface filled with beer which will attract the slugs.



Give your roses a good feed of rose fertilizer and mulch afterwards. When the leaves start to appear spray with an insecticide - Rose Clear is a good product this will control aphids and black spot. Spray every fortnight until September. Weeds will now start to grow so keep regularly hoeing as this keep the borders clear. You can now spray your box plants for the control of box blight. Buxus Health is a good product which you can buy it on Amazon. Use this 5 times a year up until September. Prune Forsythias and Chaenomeles, these shrubs put on a terrific show of colour on wood made the previous summer.

You can be very hard on pruning, its best to keep these at your desired height. Clematis will now start to grow so continue tying new shoots to form a lovely framework on a wall. This will give you a good flowering display in the summer. Enjoy your time in the garden see you next month.



BOOK REVIEW

The Betrayal by Helen Dunmore

Helen Dunmore's 2001, The Siege, told the story of the Levin family's struggle to survive the 1941-42 Siege of Leningrad – 872 days of appalling deprivation and incalculable loss of military and civilian life. In this sequel, she picks up exactly 10 years later when the war is over. Anna is still a nursery school teacher and now married to her lover, Andrei, who has completed his medical training and is a hospital doctor; they are trying to conceive a much wanted child whilst still bringing up her much younger



brother, Kolya, now a 16 year old 'rebellious teenager'.

Whilst their lives are relatively peaceful, this is Leningrad in Stalin's last years, the city still recovering from the War and the Siege, the people living in a climate of fear and oppression – they fear their neighbours and colleagues, they fear standing out, they fear being disappeared. The Ministry of State Security is ruthless, indiscriminate and unpredictable – people are arrested, tortured and shot or sent to the Gulag on the whim of a State Official.

Against this backdrop of paranoia, Andrei is asked to treat Gorya, the seriously ill young son of Volkov, a senior secret police officer, and the tension builds alongside the prospect of disaster as Andrei is unable to alleviate Gorya's increasingly desperate situation. As the daughter of a dissident poet and the self-appointed guardian of his (well hidden) literary works, Anna finds herself once again living in constant fear of hammering blows on their door at dawn that signify imminent arrest.

The sense of time and place are well written, and the juxtaposition of the domestic life experienced on rare visits to the family dacha with the harrowing accounts of the brutal treatment meted out in the Lubyanka prison means this novel has a long aftertaste. Whilst receiving generally positive reviews from our Book Club, especially for its pace, story and writing, many felt the main characters were two dimensional and faded into the background compared to lesser roles but stronger presence and depth of the older women and, much to our surprise, Volkov who managed to evoke compassion and empathy despite being 'a monster'.

For some members, the novel also raised awareness of a part of history not known to them and much discussion centred on linking the experiences described to our own of for example, the Cold War, Communist China and, closer to home, the Troubles in Northern Ireland. Published in 2010, the theme of the needs and rights of the individual taking second place to the needs of the State or collective resonate with the current situation as we all live with a global pandemic.





The Lansdowne Hall Multipitch

Further to our comments in last month's inSPIRE the Lansdowne Hall Management Committee will be reopening the multi - pitch for general use once the damage to the pitch and treatment of the boarding has been completed. Some of this work is weather dependent so no time scale on the reopening can be given.



Once reopened it is stressed that the

multi - pitch is used only for sports and not for scooters, skate or roller boarding and bicycles. Therefore, parents are asked to inform their children who use these machines that they are not allowed on the multi - pitch and if there is a recurrence of previous misuse or vandalism the multi - pitch will be permanently closed to all apart from paying members. It is hoped more use will be made of the pitch's intended purposes and that residents will join the membership scheme allowing them to reserve playing times and use the tennis net. The scheme has been in operation for several years but after an initial burst of enthusiasm interest has dwindled so now is the time to resurrect that interest. The Hall Administrator (adminstartor@lansdownehall.org) is the focal point for membership applications which involves a small charge and an undertaking to respect the pitch. The charges are

currently £20 per year for a family or individual membership and £40 for groups or clubs.

The Management Committee hopes that there is more concern within the local community than there appears to be about the wellbeing of the multi pitch as, to date, no one has come forward as requested to help us. However the request for help remains on the table and anyone interested in this community activity or the Lansdowne Hall in general should contact Alan Rosekilly (Management Committee Secretary) at Rosekilly@aol.com or 01249 814538.

manage highway We and areas amenity across the county and endeavour to cut them monthly between March November. and weather permitting. An amenity area is grassland found in sports grounds, village greens, church yards or cemeteries.

We also cut highway grass once per year, usually between May and June depending on the grass growth. Highway



verges are cut for safety reasons and we cut up to a 1 metre width, but where there are visibility issues additional grass will be cut. Highway grass is the area adjacent to the footways and roads.

Over time, the highway grass and the amenity cutting services have merged and this has led to many urban highway areas receiving an amenity cut. This will be discussed at the local highway meetings in May/June. We would like to understand the local priorities for grass cutting, balancing environmental issues against regularly cut grass.

Historically we have cut some areas of land that we do not own and are not responsible for. This will also be discussed at the next local highways meetings and we will be seeking the Parish Council's comments.



Dear Friends,




