

Editorial

This last month of Autumn sees us moving quickly into the Winter months, emphasised by the back to move Mean Greenwich Time at the end of last month with the last vestige of any lighter evenings now disappeared for few months. The of record days temperatures and almost continual sunshine of last July and August are now distant memory. but we now have the opportunity to see the natural world in a different light as each season brings new delights. We are fortunate to live in a



part of the world where we have distinct seasons to enjoy, though a case could be made for some blurring between them taking place due to climate change.

Despite our hot and dry Summer, this Autumn appears to have brought about an abundance of acorns and horse chestnuts. It was interesting to read recently that a single oak tree might produce over a million acorns during its lifetime. The oak will of course be amongst the last trees to shed its leaves, mostly leaving it until late into November to complete the task. Our own garden walnut tree has probably had its most fruitful year for a long time, but, as usual, the neighbourhood squirrels got there first and took care of every fruit.

This month records a clutch of significant anniversaries of historical events. On 18 November 1620, the Mayflower and its eighty-seven passengers landed on Cape Cod in what is now the state of Massachusetts and quickly learned that winters in that part of the United States can be severe and long! On 28 November 1919 Nancy Astor was elected to parliament in a Plymouth constituency, thus becoming this country's first female MP.

Those of us of a certain age will remember always where they were when they learned of the assassination of President Kennedy in Dallas. Texas on 22 November 1963. now almost sixty years ago.

We remember too that the guns fell silent on 11 November 1918. after four years and ninety-seven days of the Great War, culminating in the loss of many millions of military



and civilian lives and many more injured. Once again November offers us the opportunity to remember all those who have made the ultimate sacrifice during wars.

I just want to say a little bit about our current situation in the Marden Vale Benefice. Many of you are aware that we are in vacancy: we have no Team Rector, no



Administrator, no retired priests available. We have four parishes and six churches, an acting Team Rector and a House for Duty Team Vicar (not full-time), two Licensed Lay Ministers and two Lay Worship Leaders.

However, we have two people currently training as Lay Worship Leaders in Derry Hill and Bremhill, and the possibility of a retired priest becoming available. We are encouraging more involvement by members of the congregation to plan and lead services. Hopefully, by the time you read this we will be advertising for a Benefice Administrator. All four PCCs are working hard to put together a Benefice Profile as part of the process to appoint a new Team Rector. All these things take far more time than one at first imagines, but it is vital that we get this right.

In the meantime, things are stretched and challenging. I am conscious that I am not seeing as many folk as I would like or taking enough time with you. This will not always be the case and I look forward to being able to catch up with you properly in the not too distant future.

Please continue to pray for wisdom, guidance and generosity of spirit as we discern the way forward together. God always goes before us and

walks alongside us, so we draw strength and hope from God's presence among us.

There is another poem "November Skies' by John Freeman, which begins:

"Than these November skies

Is no sky lovelier. The clouds are deep:

Into their grey the subtle spies Of colour creep,

Changing that high austerity to delight,

Till even the leaden interfolds are bright."



"In all the myriad grey,

In silver height and dusky deep, remain

The loveliest.

Faint purple flushes of the unvanguished sun."

Look up, be encouraged, especially as we come to Advent Sunday on 27th November and once more look towards Emmanuel, God with us.

The Night Sky in November

The return to darker skies enables sky watchers good opportunities to observe our neighbouring planets during the month. Low in the southwest at around 20.00h on 1 November. Saturn will be located

immediately above the Moon. Once the planet has been identified in this way it will be easy to locate in the same area of the sky throughout the month.

If skies are cloudy the following evening will see the Moon immediately to the left of the ringed planet with

brilliant Jupiter slightly above and to the left of the Moon. On 4 November the Moon will be immediately below the gas giant with Saturn still in the picture. There is another opportunity to see the Moon and Saturn in close proximity on 29 November at around 17.00h low in the Southern sky, the Moon being just to the left of the planet. Jupiter is visible across the southern sky throughout the evening all month long before setting at around 02.00h.

Mars is identifiable with its reddish tinge but will be easily located on 10 November at 22.00h as the planet will be just below and to the right of the Moon. (The Moon will be sitting between two stars named Elnath



and Aldebaran at this time). Mars will be to the right of the Moon on the following evening. Mars rises at around 17.30h and will almost double in brightness during the month. Both Mercury and Venus are too close to the Sun this month and so are lost in the evening twilight – they do however reappear next month. There is a total eclipse of the Moon on 8 November but sadly it starts just after the Moon has set in our part of the world. The night of 17/18 November sees the maximum of the Leonid Meteor shower which has fast-moving 'shooting stars' as fragments of Comet Tempel-Tuttle impact on our atmosphere – best seen before Moonrise at midnight.



The impact of war on Derry Hill and Studley

On the 14th May 1920 the Derry Hill and Studley War Memorial was unveiled by Lady Maud Evelyn Petty-Fitzmaurice, Marchioness of Lansdowne. It commemorates 21 local men who died whilst serving their country in the First World War. Following the Second World War the original inscription was re-cut and a further inscription added to commemorate 6 men who died whilst serving their country in that conflict.

The memorial, with its carving of George slaying the dragon on top, was originally positioned a few feet to the east and was moved to its current position when Studley Lane was widened to incorporate a pavement.

The memorial is in such a prominent position in the village as it provided the main focus of the grief felt at great loss of losing 27 men from our small village. Ours was just one of the many tens of thousands of memorials erected across England - the result of both the huge impact on communities of the loss of three quarters of a million British lives in the First World War, and also the official policy of not repatriating the dead.

Two names that appear on neighbouring plaques on the memorial are **Fred Bull** and **Charles Mercer Nairne**.


Their stories provide just a glimpse of that time.

Fred Bull lived at Loxwell Farm on the Devizes Road – on the right as you leave Derry Hill heading for Sandy Lane. Fred had two brothers, John and George. Fred served with the Wiltshire Regiment. He was killed in action at the battle of Hooge and Bellewaarde near Ypres in Belgium on 25th September 1915. Fred's body was never recovered. His name is carved onto the Menin Gate and is also scribed onto his brother's grave (John Bull) at Christ Church. There is a very small chance that Fred now lies in the Grave of the



Unknown Solider in Westminster Abbey. In August 1920 the body that now lies in Westminster Abbey was chosen from unknown British

servicemen exhumed from four battle areas, the Aisne, the Somme, Arras and Ypres.



Charles Mercer Nairne (Lord Charles), was the younger son Maud Evelvn Marchioness Fitzmaurice. of Lansdowne and Henry Charles Keith Petty-Fitzmaurice, 5th Marguess of Lansdowne. He married and had two children. Lord Charles was serving as a Major with The Royal Dragoons. On October 30th 1917, Lord Charles was positioned within the Chateau de Hollebeke repulsing German advances. It was during this action that he lost his life at the

age of 40. Lord Charles is buried in Ypres Town Cemetery. The inscription on his gravestone reads: NOT IN VAIN, NOT UNHONOURED, NOT FORGOTTEN, THEY GAVE UP THEIR LIVES. For his actions in Flanders, he was subsequently awarded the Legion of Honour (France).

Fred and Lord Charles lost their lives within 5 miles of each other – separated by 2 years. Both lie in a Flanders Field some 250 miles East of Derry Hill.

There is a name that does not appear on our war memorial that deserves to be remembered just like Fred and Lord Charles - Captain Gerard Lysley of Pewsham House.

Captain Lysley, (Prince Consort's Own) Rifle Brigade, was killed at the age of 28 in action near Bergendal (125 miles east of Johannesburg) on Monday August 27th, 1900. Captain Lysley fell while leading his company to attack a strong

Boer position at Bergendal. Sir R Buller, in reporting this action in his despatch states: "The honours of the assault belong to the Rifle Brigade" and he "much regrets the death of Captain Lysley, who led his company most gallantly".

The next day news of the young officer's death reached Pewsham House, by means of a telegram from the War Office. The Lysley family were expecting Gerard to be returning as the campaign in South Africa was drawing to an end. Gerard was the eldest son of Frances (who built Pewsham House) and William Lysley. Frances was not at Pewsham House the day the telegram arrived, instead hearing the news a short time later in Yorkshire.

If he had lived, Gerard would have inherited Pewsham House in 1918 when his mother passed away – and perhaps a whole different set of circumstances may not have seen the sale of Pewsham House in 1945. Captain Gerard was buried very near to where he fell in South Africa. His lonely grave marked by a white cross is on the edge of a farmer's field in rural Kwazulunatal – 5,500 miles South of Derry Hill. He is remembered on the Lysley grave (the two big grey granite slabs that lie under the East Window) at Christ Church, Derry Hill.

The next time you pass the war memorial, Christ Church or the Pewsham Pub, take a moment to remember Fred, Charles and Gerard - NOT IN VAIN, NOT UNHONOURED, NOT FORGOTTEN, THEY GAVE UP THEIR LIVES.



What we've been doing in the last month

In the last month we have been very busy with two full council meetings, a strategic plan committee meeting and a finance committee meeting.

Grants have been requested and awarded to the Lansdowne Hall for the installation of a basketball ring on the multi pitch and to Calne Tennis Club for a portaloo they required to overcome a potential safeguarding issue during their sessions.

If you are a community group have a project that needs financial assistance in the community, please approach us and discuss if it is something we may be able to assist through our grant process. Application forms can be found in the document library section of our website.

We have started work on the council's budget for next year and are working hard to ensure that our services are run as cost effectively as possible.

During the last meetings the council received the Stage 2 report on the Road Feasibility Study that has been carried out. The councillors are working hard on absorbing all the information in the reports and determining the way forward and next steps. The reports can be viewed by looking in the document library section of our website.

Thermal imaging Camera Scheme

When the outside temperatures drops below 10°C we will be formally launching our Thermal Imaging Camera scheme. The Council has purchased two thermal imaging cameras, which we'll be loaning out for free to residents. These cameras enable users to identify the cold spots in their homes, where they're losing the most heat.



Almost There - Wiltshire Council Unanimously Approve a Derry Hill & Studley Parish Council

A separate Parish Council for Derry Hill & Studley took what is hopefully the final step towards fruition last month. The full council meeting of Wiltshire Council gave its unanimous approval to the various boundary changes to bring about a Parish Council for Derry Hill & Studley.

Whilst the process has been very long, it's great news that with our own genuinely local parish council, Derry Hill, Studley and the immediate surrounding area will have decisions that affect our local community made solely by councillors from our own community. We are currently an underrepresented part of Calne Without Parish Council which includes

villages that are miles away on the other side of Calne with little or no connection with our area.

Subject to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE) having no objections, the Derry Hill & Studley Parish Council will be formed at the next Council elections in May 2025. Some have described the LGBCE's involvement as a technical formality; hopefully that will be the case, but we can't yet be absolutely certain of that.

The newly formed parish council will be close to that requested by the vast majority of local residents through the major petition in 2019. There are two significant differences. Firstly, Sandy Lane will also be part of the new parish, and secondly rather than the parish being 'unwarded' with nine councillors as the petition originally sought, there will be three wards. The 'Bowood and Sandy Lane' ward and the 'Pewsham' ward will each have one councillor with the Derry Hill & Studley ward having nine councillors.

I and many other petitioners didn't really want to see the new council divided into wards, as it was felt that wards might be divisive and would weaken the cohesiveness of the newly unified community. However, Wiltshire Council respected the wishes of some residents of Sandy Lane and Pewsham that at least until the new council was well established, these two outlying parts of the community should each have their own representative.

Sadly, there are a handful of households currently in Studley, that although supported a council for Derry Hill & Studley, will unfortunately under the new arrangements, find themselves in Bremhill Parish. This followed Bremhill's request for the boundaries to be adjusted near Studley.

The formation of the Derry Hill & Studley parish will involve changes to all the seven local parish and town councils in the Calne area. Much of our current parish (Calne Without), will be joined with the nearest neighbouring parishes where they have far greater affinity and much closer links than with Derry Hill & Studley. Stockley will join with nearby Heddington, and Calston and Lower Compton joining Cherhill, where their school and local facilities are. The link below to the Wiltshire Council report gives the full details of the changes along with some detailed maps of the existing and approved new parish boundaries (pages 48 to 51).

Twice Around the World

Did you know that there are 60,000 miles of blood vessels in the human body? If you could extract the blood vessels from a single adult (let's not) and lie them out in a straight line they would reach more than twice around the world!



The heart and circulatory system is formed from stem cells in the first 10 days of life. The system needs to be flexible and stretchable to allow blood cells to pass through easily. As we get older and eat a Western diet (and/or smoke regularly) these vessels tend to clog up and become less stretchy. This plaque makes the vessels less slippery and stretchable which in turn causes blood cells to get stuck and clot.

There are two main solutions. Firstly, a stent can be inserted in the blood vessel to hold it open, but this reduces the stretchiness. Alternatively, statins can be taken to reduce the amount of plaque but statins can have side effects.

Is there another solution? The very latest scientific research suggests it is possible to reduce plaque build-up and restore blood vessel stretchiness without the need for stents or statins. Our bodies are designed to handle a plant-based diet which will improve our microbiome and restore the stretchiness to our blood vessels. It has now been shown that by reducing our intake of red meats, bacon, beefburgers etc and increasing vegetables and fruits it is possible to reduce some heart disease!

Do you know how to restart a heart? We are running a short CPR and Defib training session in the Lansdowne Hall 8-9pm on Thursday 10th November. Come along and see how to save a life.

Rise in residential burglaries

We are currently seeing a slight increase in residential burglaries in the Calne and Chippenham areas. Items being targeted in these burglaries have been that of high value gold and jewellery items.

The current price of Gold: According to The Royal Mint, on 17th October 2022, the Opal price of gold per troy ounce was GBP 1471.54. The highest recorded so far in 2022 was GBP 1668.99 on 23/07 and the lowest was GBP 1324.90 on 09/01.

This makes for a high value return on any gold and jewellery items which may be taken.

Please ensure to -

- lock windows and doors, even when at home.
- Ensure any alarms and/or CCTV are working properly. Doorbell camera are a great investment.
- Using a property marking kit. This sometimes can lead to the recovery of stolen items
- Use a time switch on internal lights when not in at home
- Keep an inventory/take photos of valuable items
- Consider storing valuables out of sight and securely elsewhere when not in use.


Household Recycling Centres to switch to their winter opening times

As per previous years, Salisbury, Trowbridge and Stanton St Quinton HRCs will be closed for an additional day a week, so will not be operating on Thursdays and Fridays. The opening days of the other centres will remain as they are.

All of these temporary changes will take affect from 1 November and last until 31 March.

Rub a Dub Pre-school

The submission this month is the hardest I have had to write so far in my role as Chair of the Committee. You may have heard on the grapevine that the preschool is struggling financially this year and I wanted to take the opportunity to update the community on what we feel is a big issue for Derry Hill.



In case you don't know who we are, I'll briefly introduce ourselves. Rub a Dub is a charity run preschool in the heart of Derry Hill. It has served the community in one form or another for 35 years. We employ 7 people and can support many families each academic year.

We run from the Lansdowne Hall at the centre of the community. The majority of the children who attend the preschool go on to attend the Derry Hill primary school.

Throughout the years at Rub-A-Dub's we have supported many children with SEND, children with Autism Spectrum Disorder, Downs syndrome, visual impairments and hearing impairments. We offer the children who wouldn't otherwise be able to access mainstream preschool the chance to come and be immersed into our community setting.

It is very important to us at Rub-A-Dub's to be inclusive and we do everything we can to ensure we can offer a place to all children no matter their needs or disability.

Financial position

This academic year we have very few children. The numbers are so low that it is causing us immediate financial concerns. We are currently running at 37% occupancy and the numbers are not projected to rise as much as we would normally expect as the terms go on.

Preschools are accustomed to a rise and fall in attendance and usually use their reserves to deal with the financial impact of low numbers. However, following COVID and its fundraising implications, our reserves are not enough to survive the academic year if our numbers/ income do not increase.

Despite running at 95% occupancy last year, we were disappointed to find that our financial situation had not improved as much as we had hoped. Due to a combination of increased outgoings, from the increased minimum wage and general increased cost of living and reduced

incoming funds, from children primarily attending using government funded hours, we are left with severe financial implications for the ongoing survival of our community preschool.

We have reduced our staff costs to the lowest possible level and have with a very heavy heart put a temporary pause on our Forest Rangers sessions as the number of children we had attending them simply did not add up financially.

I won't go on about all the many things that we are doing to improve the financial stability of the setting (there are many!) but we wanted to let the community know what was going on in case anyone would like to help in any way.

What can you do to help

Spread the word about the pre-school as we need to improve our occupancy levels.

If you know of somewhere some promotional leaflets could be left, please let us know.

Help with the fundraising. We have many fundraising events going on that we would love the village community to be part of, we have a quiz night on Friday 9th December and a fantastic Elf Academy Event for the little ones on Tuesday 29th November. look out for our information on our Facebook page.



The New Highway Code

Changes were made to The Highway Code on 29 January 2022.

Here are some I have picked out:

- At a junction you should give way pedestrians crossing or waiting to cross a road into which or from which you are turning.
- People cycling, riding a horse or driving a horse-drawn vehicle should respect the safety of people walking in shared spaces, people walking should also take care not to obstruct or endanger them.



but

to

- Take care when passing parked vehicles, leaving enough room (a door's width or 1 metre) to avoid being hit if a car door is opened
- 4. Watch out for people walking into their path
- You may cross a double-white line if necessary (provided the road is clear) to overtake someone cycling or riding a horse if they are travelling at 10 mph or less
- 6. When people cycling are going straight ahead at a junction, they have priority over traffic waiting to turn into or out of a side road, unless road signs or markings indicate otherwise.
- 7. People driving or riding a motorcycle should give priority to people cycling on roundabouts.
- 8. The code recommends a new technique when leaving vehicles. It's sometimes called the 'Dutch Reach'.

 Where people driving or passengers in a vehicle are able to do so, they should open the door using their hand on the opposite side to the door they are opening. For example, using their left hand to open a door on their right-hand side.



A time to share

Recently a stranger, a young woman, moved into my spare room. Before she arrived, I was nervous. I'd heard stories about house shares that had gone wrong: lodgers who expected hotel service; who made a terrible mess; who were noisy; who smoked or drank too much.

"It's wise to set clear boundaries," said the rep from the refugee department at Wiltshire Council. So I settled on 'No smoking', and 'No visitors', and hoped for the best.



Needless to say my new lodger is lovely: quiet, considerate and thankful to be safe. The council rep is just a phone call away if I need guidance. A government payment covers any extra costs that I might incur. Honestly, the risk is minimal, and I'm glad I took a chance in opening my door.

Imagine, now, that bombs were falling in Bath or Swindon, not that many miles away. Imagine that you don't feel safe, that you need to escape abroad. And now imagine that in some far away country there's a household where you can stay... how welcome that sanctuary would be.

There are various ways to sponsor a refugee. Easiest method is to register interest at gov.uk. In due course your local council contacts you, to invite you to join their list of available households. They send someone to okay your property and organise a DBS (criminal record) check. And then, when your room is needed... your new lodger comes to stay.





