Editorial

Although not a particular aficionado of poetry, the arrival of this month invariably reminds me of that well-known offering from Robert Browning – and also the long-ago days of A-Level English Literature – 'Home - Thoughts from Abroad' with its simple but memorable opening line 'O to be in England now that April's there'. I guess this poem of two short verses serves to sum up the evocation of Spring for many people, even though the season has already been underway for a month. April certainly sees a real flourishing of new life and a re-awakening of the natural world.

Robert Browning must have been feeling pretty nostalgic when he was writing the poem as he was in Northern Italy at the time, a part of the world not without its own charms. He even favourably compares our humble buttercup with the 'gaudy melon flower'. The poem also refers to elm trees coming into leaf – the subsequent loss of almost our entire population of elm trees since would no doubt make him very sad.

The reawakening process will see the return of migrating birds to our shores and especially towards month's end the first swifts will reappear. They mate for life and will return to the same nest site to reproduce before leaving our shores in August. They will also form part of the dawn chorus which gets into its stride this month and lasts until July as birds sing to attract a mate or protect territory. Our gardens will soon witness the evening acrobatics of bats as they come out of a long period of hibernation and begin to feast on insects prior to getting down to serious reproductive business.

The cherry blossom season (Sakura) which is so highly anticipated in Japan reaches its peak there this month and the blossom is also a feature of Washington DC's Potomac riverside whilst the trees do of course bring a riot of pink to our own gardens.

This month sees the anniversary of when the first bananas were seen in a shop in this country – in Holborn, London on 10 April 1633.... but these were some cultivated in hothouse conditions in Derbyshire however and the fruit did not arrive for general sale until the late nineteenth century. The first cordless telephone went on sale in the UK as long ago as 14 April 1983 – what would we do without them now, I wonder.

9 April 1806 sees the anniversary of the birth of one of the greatest engineers and inventors of the nineteenth century – Isambard Kingdom Brunel. Just thirty-two years later on 8 April 1832 his new steamship SS Great Britain left Bristol on her maiden voyage to Boston Massachusetts, a vessel which is still on display in Bristol Docks. At the same time, he was also busying himself with railway construction, bridges, tunnels, steam engines, dockyards and other projects. He was also fluent in French!

Dear Friends.

Some years ago we thought we would try something a little different for our Easter meal. This time the roast lamb included anchovies and for dessert we decided to have baklava. I thought it would be fun



to make it ourselves. The recipe promised it was straightforward and didn't really take that long – you simply needed to have all the ingredients ready so the filo pastry didn't dry out before you needed to use it. In reality it took several hours and I used pretty much every kitchen utensil I owned "getting the ingredients ready". The more accomplished cooks among you will probably wonder at my ineptitude.

However, the combination of pastry, nuts, spices and sticky sweet syrup produces the most sumptuous, delicious dessert and it was fun to spend time together making it as a family.

In my defence, I recently found a recipe for baklava which stated that Greek women spend days getting the baklava ready for the Easter feast in the Orthodox tradition. I have also discovered that it is a Greek tradition to use thirty-three layers of filo pastry, one for each year of Jesus' life.

Perhaps we'll have another go at making baklava for Easter, with all thirty-three layers. A shared activity like this does provide an opportunity for far ranging conversations about all manner of things, from the mundane to matters of life and death and beyond. And there are moments in the process which require such focussed concentration that an almost prayerful silence descends

It seems a perfect recipe for reflecting on the events of Holy Week and Easter; to ponder the life, death and resurrection of Jesus; to celebrate together. We will, of course, be doing these things in our churches and out in the community. But it feels just as important to share these deeper conversations with our loved ones.

May I wish you all a blessed Easter. As the Greeks would say: Christos Anesti. Alithos Anesti!

Alleluia! Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

The Night Sky in April

Towards the end of last month, we were treated to some impressive images of Jupiter and Venus gradually coming closer together in the western sky shortly after sunset, joined by the nearby Moon on occasions. Whilst the gas giant has dominated our skies over recent months, the planet will recede into the evening twilight during this month so will no longer be visible to us until it reappears into our morning skies later in the year. Jupiter is in fact at 'superior conjunction' on 11 April – the planet will be directly opposite us on the far side of the Sun as seen from Earth.

Venus however is still very much with us, shining brilliantly in the western sky until it sets around midnight. On 11 April at around 21.00h Venus will pass just to the left of a 'smudge' or cluster of stars known as the Pleiades. Also known as the Seven Sisters as this number of stars can be easily seen by naked eye within it, in reality a look through binoculars or a small telescope will confirm that there are many more than this within the cluster. The Pleiades is dominated by a cluster of hot, blue luminous stars some 444 light years from Earth. Once identified like this the cluster can easily be located in the future.....which is useful as another opportunity for easy identification comes along between 21-23 April!

Looking towards the western sky at around 21.45 on 21st, the Moon will be slightly above and to the left of The Pleiades with the bright star to its left being Alderbaran. Just above these, Venus will be shining brilliantly. On the following evening at the same time, all these features will be visible once again except that the Moon will be sitting almost on top of our sister planet.

Mars is becoming more difficult to spot but an opportunity occurs to locate it more easily on 25 April at around 22.00h when the planet with its reddish tinge will be sitting just to the left of the crescent Moon. The night of 22 and 23 April should provide good viewing conditions to view the maximum of the Lyrid meteor shower as the Moon will be out of the way and the skies will be darkened. The shower is formed from debris emanating from Comet Thatcher burning up in our atmosphere.

The second vicar of Christ Church Derry Hill

Revered John Lowder was the second vicar of Derry Hill and Studley from 1845 to 1848. He had formally been curate at Christian Malford. He was ordained and then married Lucy Windsor on 1 September 1840 at St Swithin's, Walcot near Bath. They had 5 children - at least one was born at Derry Hill.

With much excitement the Reverend was appointed Chaplain of Shanghai in China in 1848. The family moved lock stock and barrel to the other side of the world with the best wishes of the people of Derry Hill and a Studley.

A newspaper at the time wrote: 'It will be gratifying, especially to the friends of Rev. John Lowder, incumbent of Derry Hill, near Chippenham, son of the late John Lowder, esq., of Bath, to hear that his recent appointment to the chaplaincy of Shanghai, in China, under most creditable circumstances, has called forth a strong expression of esteem and sympathy from the clergy and other friends of his neighbourhood; who, in order to give shape and consistence to their feelings, have pressed upon his acceptance a purse of 100 guineas, accompanied by a

valedictory letter, signed by the contributors, commending him to the grace and protection of HIM whose minister he is.'

Within a few months Reverend Lowder was dead aged 39. He died when bathing in the sea off the Island of Poo Too. His body was found 5 days later.

Police Crime and Incident Updates

- 20/02/2023 19:39hrs, a black BMW was driving down Snowhill near to Hilmarton where it lost control spinning in the road damaging all sides of the vehicle. The Driver sustained some injuries and was treated by paramedics and was later conveyed to hospital for further treatment. The road was closed for some time to allow for the vehicle to be recovered. The driver was breathalysed at the roadside which returned a negative result.
- Between 16/02/2023 00:01 and 22/02/2023 10:30hrs, Unknown suspect(s) had gained entry to a garden in Foxham and stolen step ladder A frames, 4x tyres and 4x smaller ones from the back of a jeep that was also in the garden TVO £1400. If you have any information which may assist us in this matter, please advise us on 101 quoting the reference number: 54230019626
- On 22/02/2023 10:30hrs, a black Volvo V50 was stopped on the A342 in Derry Hill for careless driving and excess speed.
 The driver has also been reported for driving other than in accordance with their licence and with no insurance.
- On 23/02/2023 06:45hrs, a white Citroen Berlingo panel van collided with a Brown Yamaha moped on the A4 Studley crossroads. At the time the weather was poor, heavy rain and high winds causing reduced visibility.

It's believed at the time the van driver misjudged / failed to observe the moped travelling up A4 towards Calne and has pulled out at low speed into the path of the moped. The moped estimated speed was well below the posted limit in the location.

The road was partially closed to allow for the rider of the moped to be immobilised and treated by paramedics at the scene. The rider was later taken to hospital for further treatment for neck and back pain. The driver of the van was not injured in the collision.

• On 28/02/2023 19:35hrs, a Black Mini Cooper had overtaken a tractor colliding with an oncoming Beige Citroen C3 on the A3102 Between Hilmarton and Calne.

The road was closed for approximately two hours to allow for the vehicles involved to be recovered and one of the drivers to be treated at the scene by paramedics for minor injuries. The driver of the Mini Cooper was reported for careless driving and contravening a double white line.

 On 02/03/2023 20:23hrs, it was reported that a black Vauxhall Insignia had been seen to be driven in an erratic manner in Church Road, Derry Hill. It was also reported that after this sighting, the vehicle had collided with a property entrance causing substantial damage.



The driver failed to stop at the scene and travelled along the A4 towards the direction of Calne. The NPAS police helicopter was deployed to the location to assist officers searching the area. The driver of the vehicle was located in Derry Hill and breathalysed. The driver was arrested on suspicion of driving under the influence of drink or drugs due to providing a positive breath sample over the prescribed legal limit. The driver was then conveyed to custody.

Road safety

We are continuing to monitor any collisions or incidents on the A4 and surrounding routes of Derry Hill and will look to target those locations for preventive patrols and enforcement action where possible.

At a recent Calne Area Board meeting it was also raised regarding the increase in traffic on our rural roads due to a section of Dauncey, near Lyneham being closed.

We will be paying particular attention all routes including those in East Tytherton, Bremhill and Foxham over coming weeks. We have forwarded on reports of vehicles travelling at excessive speeds through the 20mph limit in the village of Derry Hill to our Roads Policing Unit, who will also be looking to target this area in the coming weeks.

The Calne Neighbourhood Team are fully committed to keeping our roads as safe as possible and we will continue to conduct speed checks throughout our area.

How Does a Defibrillator Work?

As the name suggests, defibrillation stops **fibrillation**, the useless trembling that a person's heart muscles can adopt during a cardiac arrest. Simply speaking,



a defibrillator works by using a moderately high voltage (something like 200–1000 volts) to pass an electric current through the heart so it's shocked into working normally again – at least that's the objective!

The kind of defibrillator you see on TV consists of an electric supply unit and two metal electrodes called **paddles** that are pressed very firmly to the patient's chest using insulating plastic handles (so the person using them doesn't get a shock too). In a hospital the doctor manually sets the voltage and usually increases it if the first attempt fails. The important thing is getting the current to flow through the heart, so where the paddles are applied is crucial. They must also make good electrical contact with the skin, so a solid or liquid conducting gel is usually applied to the patient's chest first.

Our automatic defibrillators in the village are designed to be used by untrained people and issue precise audible instructions telling the user exactly what to do and where to place the pads. They use sticky, self-adhesive electrode pads instead of paddles for safety and simplicity: once the pads are stuck on, the operator can stand well clear of the patient's body and that reduces the risk of their getting an electric shock. Our automatic units test the heart first before applying an appropriate electric shock if needed. If the patient's heart is working correctly our automatic units do not give an electric shock, so they are completely insafe!





Living well with Parkinson's

April marks Parkinson's Awareness Month. Often associated with its distinctive tremor, Parkinson's is the fastest growing neurological condition in the world. Being diagnosed with a degenerative disease is never easy. However, in my years in care, I have seen that — with the right treatment, lifestyle and support — it is possible to lead a fulfilling and happy life with Parkinson's.

Understanding Parkinson's

Parkinson's is caused by the breakdown or death of brain cells that produce dopamine – a hormone that helps regulate the body's movement. A reduction in dopamine is behind many of the symptoms of the disease. In the UK, around 145,000 people have Parkinson's. Scientists still don't know exactly what causes it but many agree that a combination of genetic and environmental factors is likely responsible. While a cure is not yet known, there are ways to manage Parkinson's symptoms and continue to live well.

Parkinson's and care

Treatments including physiotherapy and medication such as levodopa can help greatly with managing Parkinson's symptoms, maintaining independence and improving quality of life. Along with these, the right diet, exercising, socialising and stimulation are key.

Parkinson's affects people differently, and can progress at very different rates. As the condition advances, the person's mobility or mental ability declines and often people need increasing assistance.

At some point, regular professional support is likely required. This may be in the form of care at home, or the person and their family may consider the benefits of 24/7 care in a residential or nursing home.

Living with Parkinson's, or supporting someone with it, is a very unique journey. Fortunately, there is a wealth of information available. The charity Parkinson's UK is a great first start (they have a local branch and support group, in Malmesbury, you can reach on 0344 225 3694). So is speaking with your GP. 




Eight members braved the snow to attend a coffee

Teachings from an ancient flower

There's a magnolia tree that I know and love. With spring blooms of velvet pink, it brings pleasure to all who view it. But my magnolia is more than just a bunch of gorgeous flowers. Its cup-shaped blossoms tell an ancient story. And if I slow down enough to listen to that story, wellbeing results. Here are a few of magnolia's insights.

Age is relative. Magnolias have been growing for 20 million years. In comparison, humans






