The Sky at Night


The night sky in September 2023 is a sight to behold. The stars are bright and clear, and the planets are out in full force. Here are some of the highlights you can see in the night sky in September:

- Jupiter: Jupiter is the brightest planet in the sky in September, and it can be seen in the southwest after sunset. It will be at its closest approach to Earth on September 20, so it will be even brighter than usual.
- Saturn: Saturn is also visible in the night sky in September, and it will be in opposition on September 27. This means that it will be opposite the Sun in the sky, so it will appear at its brightest.
- Neptune: Neptune is at opposition on September 19, so it will be the brightest it will be all year. It will be visible in the constellation Aquarius, and you can use binoculars or a telescope to get a better look.

• The Great Square of Pegasus: The Great Square of Pegasus is

an asterism that is easy to spot in the night sky in September. It is made up of four bright stars that form a square shape.

• The Beehive Cluster: The Beehive Cluster is a star cluster that is located in the constellation Cancer. It is visible to the naked eye, but it looks even better through binoculars or a telescope.



These are just a few of the highlights you can see in the night sky in September 2023. With clear skies and a little bit of patience, you can enjoy a truly spectacular view of the stars.

New Housing in Derry Hill & Studley

How should our village develop over the next 15 years?

Many residents would not want to see any more houses built in Derry Hill and Studley - that's almost certainly not a realistic option as Government require Wiltshire to have tens of thousands of new houses to be built between now and 2038.

Wiltshire Council have recently published the <u>latest draft of their Local</u> <u>Plan</u> which allocates where those new houses should be built. They are proposing that Derry Hill & Studley should have at least another 30 new houses in the next 15 years. That seems very hard to justify considering the previous version of the draft Local Plan only required 23 houses at a time when Wiltshire's target was around 46,000 houses. The latest draft plan now envisages only 37,000 houses. Bearing in mind that 22,000 houses have already been built or have planning permission, the requirement for new houses has been reduced by about 35% but bizarrely the allocation for new housing in Derry Hill and Studley has increased by 30%. How can that be justified?

How did Wiltshire Planners come up with that number when almost every other town and village has seen its allocation significantly reduced? Interestingly, Wiltshire Planners do have history of miscalculating housing numbers for our village

The draft Local Plan gives no credible explanation why our village has had its housing allocation increased dramatically - when other villages and towns in Wiltshire are seeing a large reduction in the number of houses required. Derry Hill & Studley, along with Calne, have for many years far exceeded their share of new houses in Wiltshire without seeing significant investment in infrastructure. The previous draft Plan claimed to recognise this but this has now been ignored and again our village is having to bear far more than its fair share of new housing.

The Calne area including Derry Hill and Studley has seen much greater increases in houses than other parts of Wiltshire without any significant increase in local jobs. This has lead to our villages being some of the most unsustainable in terms of travel to work. There is very high car usage, high levels of long-distance commuting and very few people using sustainable travel by bus, cycling or walking for journeys to work. Derry Hill and Studley is one of the only designated 'large villages' in Wiltshire to have a very busy major road passing through it and surrounds a dangerous and congested crossroad. Again, none of these factors or it's unsustainable location and previous very high growth in housing appear to have been taken into account.

Wiltshire are consulting on their latest proposals between 26th September and the 22nd November with a Webinar at 6:30 on 10th October and 'drop in' meeting in Calne Library between 3:30 and 7 pm on October 16th. Whatever your views on the need for housing, I'd strongly encourage you to look at the proposals, join the webinar, attend the 'Drop-In' meeting if you can, and respond to the consultations. This link gives more details of the consultation and information on the Local Plan.

A number of local residents have recently expressed concerns having noticed land surveyors working in Old Road and Studley Crossroads and come to what seems the logical conclusion, that Bowood Estate is again looking to prepare proposals for new housing in the village.

I think that is likely to be true, as Bowood, in response to a call for landowners to identify land that they might wish to develop, did submit sites including their desire to build 50 to 70 houses in the field between Old Rd and the A4. There are few details of their plans for the field but their request will be considered as part of the Review of the Calne Community Neighbourhood Plan. Recommendations will then be made to the Parish Council on where Wiltshire Local Plan's requirement for housing in the next 15 years would be built in Derry Hill and Studley. The updated Neighbourhood Plan, once approved and adopted by the Parish and Wiltshire Councils, would move forward to become a strong planning document that development would be expected to adhere to.

The only other formal request by an owner of land in our village is the redevelopment of the Bethesda Care Home on Church Road in order to create 5 to 7 new houses. That too will be considered as part of the Neighbourhood Plan review. As a potential "Brownfield development" that site may well be viewed as a strong candidate for new housing to count towards the village's housing allocation

In the past, almost all residents in Studley have strongly favoured a more appropriate form of housing development, whereby all of Studley, including Old Road, continues to develop as it has for several hundred years by individual new houses being built where gaps exist along the existing roads. That would allow Studley to continue to evolve as a linear village rather than seeing large housing estates on greenfield sites. That more appropriate approach, opposing estate development was supported by the overwhelming majority of Studley residents through a petition around the time Studley Gardens was developed. Sadly, resident's views have been ignored.

Hopefully this information will be of help. Parish Councillors and members of the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group will be at the Parish Council's Energy Saving event at Lansdowne Hall on Saturday 16th September and I'm sure they'll be happy to hear your views and try to answer your questions on new housing in our villages

Book Club Review

The Paper Palace by Miranda Cowley Heller

This was a gripping if, at times, a rather uncomfortable read but one that provided our book club with plenty of topics for a lively discussion. The paper palace is actually a rustic cabin used as a holiday home in the Cape Cod area of New England where the central character, Elle Bishop spends every summer with her family. The action all takes place in one 24-hour period with flashbacks to her childhood and adolescence and describes her relationships with her family and friends and the



way in which parenting styles influence one's character and actions in adulthood. It is really a love story but certainly not a conventional one.

The descriptions of the area with its woods, lakes, beaches and sand dunes are beautiful and the characters are well drawn and interesting. The book was well written and engaging but some people would find it disturbing as there were some unpleasant characters and some vivid descriptions of unsettling events. However I am glad I chose it because it was very readable and it certainly made me appreciate my own uneventful childhood.

What we've been doing in the last month;

There has not been a council meeting in August but everyone has still been busy. Work continues on our Road Safety project and we hope to be able to bring you a positive update soon.

We have continued to work on the neighbourhood plan update and will be working towards the consultation on the final plan. Keep an eye on our website and Facebook page for further information.

We have recently completed our project to refurbish the Church Road red telephone box. We obviously have a duty to maintain the assets in the village that we own. It was noted recently that the paintwork was in poor repair and it was decided to embark on a full refurb of the box. We are really proud of the result and hope you like it too, we think it provides a lovely entrance into the village.





We continue to refer items to the Parish Steward for him to do on our behalf. He has recently been filling pot holes along Church Road and he was our mystery man who mended the Lansdowne Cresent Road sign. If you notice a small highway issue that can be mended by our 'man in a van' please feel free to get in touch and I can see if its something the Parish Steward scheme can help with. If not we can arrange to report it vis the 'my wilts' app.

Update on the Speed Review on the A4 – Pewsham to Calne Calne Without Parish Council is very pleased that Wiltshire Council has commissioned a further review of the current speed limits

between Calne and Chippenham. We really appreciate the efforts of our Wiltshire Councillor Ashley O'Neill in getting this progressed.

We very much welcome the recommendation to reduce the speed limit from 50mph to 40mph through Studley Crossroads, which is a positive step forward towards making the junction safer. We further welcome the recommendation to reduce the speed limit to 50mph between Studley Crossroads and Norley Lane.

We do, however, regret that the new report this time recommends retaining the national speed limit between Calne and Norley Lane, and again between Studley Crossroads and the hazardous junction with the A342.

We will be considering the proposal at our next Parish Council meeting on 11th September to agree a formal response.

Wiltshire Council LOCAL PLAN

Local Plan consultation begins next month with in-person and online events

The consultation for the Wiltshire Local Plan begins on Wednesday 27 September, with in-person events being held across the county to enable you to find out more.

We are holding 16 drop-in events at libraries and leisure centres around Wiltshire and a live webinar-style event on Microsoft Teams. You can just turn up to the in-person events, but you will need to register beforehand for the online event.

If you cannot make your local in-person event, you are welcome to attend any of the others to discuss the plan and your own area – all events are open to all.

The Local Plan sets out the vision and framework for housing, infrastructure and land for employment growth for the next 15 years. Once adopted, all planning applications will be determined against the plan, making it the most important place-shaping document for Wiltshire.

The consultation begins on Wednesday 27 September and ends at 23:59 on Wednesday 22 November. To find out more about the events and to sign up for the online event, visit the Local Plan webpage.

Recycling news from Wiltshire Council

"Sort it before you bring it" – help us recycle as much as possible at our household recycling centres

First, we asked you to help sort your kerbside collection waste, to great success, and now we're asking for you to please step-up once again so that we can recycle even more at our household recycling centres (HRCs).

Our data shows that more than a third of the items put in the general rubbish skips at our HRCs could have been recycled.

With that in mind, as part of our 'Recycling: Let's Sort It' campaign we encourage you to sort your waste out before you visit your local HRC, ensuring that all items are separated correctly.

If you don't have time to do this before you set off, we will soon be providing designated sorting areas at each of our HRCs to give you the opportunity to sort your materials on-site as easily as possible – with our friendly staff on hand to provide advice and guidance. The sorting areas will be introduced first in Devizes and Warminster from 4 September and then others will follow gradually after that.

Some of the items you can recycle at our sites include:

- textiles and clothing
- plastics
- paper
- cardboard
- metals, cans and aerosols
- electrical items
- wood
- soil and rubble

So, whether you have been clearing out the garage, moving house, or just having a tidy up – please take the time and care to sort out your recycling before you visit the HRC. More information, and FAQs can be found at <u>https://www.wiltshire.gov.uk/hrc-waste-sorting</u>

Small rechargeable items collected at the kerbside

Also, don't forget you can also now recycle small rechargeable electrical items as part of your fortnightly kerbside collection service. These items include:

- MP3 players

- shavers/trimmers
- all vapes and e-cigarettes
- smart watches
- mobile phones
- digital cameras
- charging devices/power banks
- wireless earphones

All you need to do is place these items in a carrier bag next to your blue-lidded bin.

Other News

Two people were arrested, and a large quantity of cannabis seized following a warrant in Calne this week.

The warrant was executed on Thursday (10/8) by the Burglary and Youth and Gang Violence Unit with support from officers from the local Neighbourhood Policing Team at an address in Stockley.



A man in his 20s was arrested

on suspicion of being concerned in the supply of class B drugs.

Following further enquiries as a result of the warrant, a second man aged in his 20s and linked to the address was arrested in the Westbury area on suspicion of being concerned in the supply of class A and B drugs, possession of an offensive weapon, possession of a bladed article and dangerous driving.

Both remain in custody for further questioning.

As part of the operation, a large quantity of designer clothing was seized, and enquiries will continue.

Sgt Mike Tripp said: "With the expertise and assistance of the Wiltshire Burglary YGV team we will continue to target and disrupt individuals who come to our attention in the local area looking to promote and progress their criminal activity.

"We'd urge the local community to continue to assist us by reporting any concerns they may have that people living in their neighbourhood may be involved in criminal activity and report it to us immediately." To report concerns, call 101, or 999 if a crime is in progress. Alternatively, information can be reported to Crime Stoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111.

Road Safety

Patrols increased in Calne rural areas due to concerns raised by horse riders of vehicles passing too close.

Over the past few weeks, we have seen an increased in reports of

vehicles passing too fast and too close to horse riders. In some cases, drivers have also been reported as showing aggressive behaviour when passing riders.

In response to these concerns, we have, and will be focusing more of our patrols around the villages of - Yatesbury, Hilmarton, Heddington and Stockley, Bremhill, Compton



Bassett, East Tytherton, Foxham, Cherhill, Derry Hill, Spirt Hill, Ratford and Charlcutt.

On Monday 21st August, PCSO Mark Cook, Horse riders and a dog walker appeared on BBC Points West News to raise awareness of this issue.





PCSO Mark Cook of the Calne Neighbourhood Team says: "we all use our roads, and we all should be showing each other the same courtesy.

"More care needs to be taken when drivers pass other more vulnerable road users such as - horse riders, cyclist, motorcyclists and pedestrians.

"Horse riders are increasingly wearing body cameras whist out riding. We would always encourage riders who have captured any poor or aggressive driving on video to send this to us. We will always review any footage received. This could be used in any potential enforcement action or prosecution. "Please slow your speed and give extra room when passing horse riders on our roads.

Our patrols will continue in these areas, and we will be looking to liaise more with our local riders and groups over the coming weeks."

Before the Golden Gates

In 1792 Archibald Robertson describes his departure from Bowood, using what is now the road from the Bowood Hotel to the Golden




Gates -"The park is laid out in rides, for the convenience of against shelter the different winds, as well as for prospect: and it may be curios to а planter to observe, the



mass of wood that has been planted since 1762. Before such time there was nothing

but coppice wood, with some standard trees, chiefly pollards. The road to Bath goes out at Derry Hill, where it is intended to erect a

gateway, or some other large building, which the situation calls for. it being knoll а commanding most а extensive prospect. bounded bv the Gloucestershire hills on the riaht and the Somersetshire on the left". If you stood at the junction of Church Road and Devizes Road in the late 1830's you would have seen the Lansdowne original (formally the Arms



Shelburne Arms). A thatched(?) Structure standing just in front of where the Golden Gates are today. In 1841 the site was cleared, and the Golden Gates were built as the primary entrance to Bowood Park.

The new Lansdowne Arms were built on its current site opposite the gates in 1843.



So why was the Golden Gates built? 1841 saw the Great Western Railway reach out from London Paddington to Chippenham offering a fast and reliable route to London. Lord Lansdowne commissioned Sir Charles Barry, architect of the Houses of Parliament, to design and build a new lodge on the western perimeter of the park – closest to Chippenham.

Now, with all this in mind picture the scene in 1838 when people gathered in front of

the original Lansdowne Arms to witness the Great Wiltshire pudding.

The newspaper of the day reported "The Great Wiltshire Pudding – which has excited so much attention in the neighbourhood of Derry Hill, was yesterday distributed to the poor children (upwards of 200 in number) of that place. Seats were provided for them in front of the Lansdowne Arms; the band playing during this time. Notwithstanding the number of persons to witness this novelty was upwards of 3,000 the greatest order of decorum was observed; and after the children had been supplied, the remainder was given to the spectators. The pudding weighted, before it was boiled, 340lbs. It boiled from Sunday Morning, 10 o'clock until Wednesday, 11 o'clock".

If you want to try Wiltshire Pudding yourself then follow these easy steps: 12 oz (340g) Self Raising flour, 6 oz (170g) lard, 3 oz (85g) white sugar, milk and water or water to mix, pinch salt, fruit as available, suitably prepared, about 3 or 4 handfuls. Rub fat into flour, sugar and salt. Stir in green gooseberries or rhubarb in 1-inch lengths or apples peeled, cored and sliced with 4 or 5 cloves. Mix with sufficient liquid to make a stiff mixture. Steam in well-greased basin and serve in front of the Golden Gates.

Cardiac Arrest or Heart Attack ?

Cardiac Arrest occurs when an electrical malfunction of the heart causes it to suddenly stop beating. A victim will collapse and lose consciousness. Victims have no pulse and will be gasping or not



breathing. Without treatment death can occur quickly.

- 1. Call 999 for help.
- 2. Start CPR manually
- 3. Use a defibrillator (AED) and continue CPR until emergency help arrives.

Heart Attack occurs when blood flow to the heart is impeded due to a blocked artery. Symptoms may be sudden or increase over time and include pain in the chest, back or jaw, shortness of beath, cold sweats and/or nausea and vomiting. If the artery is not unblocked quickly the heart can be damaged.

- 1. Call 999 for help
- 2. Chew and swallow aspirin
- 3. Start CPR if the person becomes unconscious

Put simply Cardiac Arrest is an electrical problem, Heart Attack is a plumbing problem, but in either case call 999 straight away !

Why you need to write or amend your Will today

Many of my clients ask the same questions and have the same queries about Wills, why they need them, what happens if you don't have one, can certain individuals be left out, does everything have to be given in equal shares, and more. Here I address these queries so you can start to consider how you would want things to be left.



Why should I make a Will and what happens if I die without one? If you die without leaving a Will there are strict 'Intestacy Rules' in place that deal with the distribution of the money, possessions, and property. These rules are not necessarily going to reflect how you want your estate to be dealt with. If you have specific wishes as to who benefits from your estate, you need to express this in a Will.

Having a Will is also a good way of making arrangements for the care of your child(ren). You can appoint a Guardian who will step in to look after the child(ren) in the event that both parents die before the child(ren) are 18.

The Intestacy Rules do not make provision for partners or stepchildren, so if you would like either to benefit from your estate you need to note this within a Will.

My partner and I are separating, what will happen with my Will?

Divorce does not revoke a Will, instead your former spouse will be treated as if they have predeceased you and any gift to them will not take effect. If you should be separating from your partner or spouse, you should review any existing Will, or make a new Will, particularly if there are children involved.

Can I leave someone out of my Will?

In England and Wales, you have 'testamentary freedom' which means that as citizens we are entitled to leave our estate to whomever we please and we are not 'forced' to pass our estate on to our children, dependants or the state.

You can therefore decide to include or exclude anyone. However, if someone feels they should be entitled to part of your estate they can

bring a claim. The likelihood of success will depend on the circumstances and will be decided by a Judge.

If you were to leave someone, such as a child, out of your Will, we would recommend you write a 'Letter of Wishes' explaining your reasons. The Court will take this into consideration.

What happens if I get married?

Marriage voids a Will, so it is very important if you have a Will to remember to get it updated either before or after your wedding!

I can always draft a Will to be in anticipation of marriage, if the date is imminent, which will mean it will not be void once the marriage has occurred.





Wellbeing notes Coconut flapjack recipe



Back in the 1970s, I was given a new, blank recipe book. The first treats I added were simple, buttery flapjacks, which tasted lovely, but were... gooey. Over the next two decades, in a string of London kitchens, I tweaked the original ingredients. The notebook filled up, but the flapjacks remained a favourite. They were so easy to make, and almost everyone liked them.

In the 2000s, cooking times were adjusted for an old Aga that I acquired, in Old Derry Hill. But then, unaccountably, the book was put on a shelf and forgotten. Not any more, though. "Oh, my goodness, these are amazing," said one friend. Another mentioned that oats and coconuts are healthy. A few asked for the recipe. So here it is.:

Ingredients

170g butter1 tbsp honey1 tbsp golden syrupHandful of sultanas

170g demerara sugar280g oats30g desiccated coconut30g chocolate chips. Optional

Method

Set oven at 150°C (fan-assisted)/170°C (conventional) or Aga baking oven.

Butter and line a square 7"/18cm baking tray.

Slice the butter and melt gently in a pan. Add honey, syrup and sugar. Stir from time to time until dissolved.

Add oats and coconut to a large bowl. Pour melted mixture over and mix well. Stir in sultanas and, if using, chocolate chips.

Transfer mixture to baking tray and press down with the back of a spoon.

Bake for 16 to 20 minutes, or until browning slightly at edges.

(If using Aga, place on oven shelf on floor of baking oven, or use roasting oven with cold shelf above.)

Remove from oven and leave to cool thoroughly before cutting into squares.





