Hello again! We are now well and truly into Autumn and looking forward to cosy evenings by the fire! And what about all those warming, comforting and nourishing casseroles and winter meals that reminds you of years gone by? We all need to feel comforted at this time of year but not only by food. The company of others is so important particularly to those who live alone. I know my Mum really does not like the long winter evenings, she locks her door at 4pm and it does not open again until about 9am the next morning. It must be like being a prisoner in your own home. As it gets colder, please check on your elderly neighbours and make sure they have all they need – including company for a chat and cup of tea. Remember that it could be you one day and think about how wonderful it will be to have an occasional visitor!

I believe that most, if not all, our Harvest services have taken place now but please do spare a thought for the farmers who, due to the poor weather we have had this year, are still struggling with their harvesting. It is so easy for us to just take our vegetables for granted when we pick them up from the shelves at Tesco, or wherever we shop, but perhaps the next time you do you could take a moment to stop and think about all the hard work that has gone into getting them there.

Looking forward to the end of the month and beginning of November – in the Church calendar November 1st brings All Saints Day, the day commemorates all those who have attained the <u>beatific vision</u> in Heaven. In the Catholic Church and many <u>Anglican</u> churches, the next day specifically commemorates the departed faithful. Christians who celebrate All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day do so in the fundamental belief that there is a prayerful spiritual bond between those in heaven (the "<u>Church triumphant</u>"), and the living (the "<u>Church militant</u>") All Souls Day is a day of prayer for the dead, particularly, but not exclusively, one's relatives. In <u>Western Christianity</u> the annual celebration is now held on 2nd November and is associated with <u>All Saints' Day</u> and its vigil, All Hallow's Eve or <u>Halloween</u> (31st October). Please note that there is no mention of ghouls and ghosts or 'trick or treating'! – These are solemn occasions both of which are celebrated in our churches.

Returning to thoughts of those who live alone, please do let me know if there is anyone in particular in need of a visit from me or any member of the clergy team.

And finally, a word of very warm welcome to the new Rector of the Marden Vale Team, the Reverend Caspar Bush, who is now in post and, I am sure, will hit the ground running and be very keen to get into the rhythm of church life here in this beautiful part of Wiltshire.

The Sky at Night

With longer nights and crisp autumn air, this month offers a perfect opportunity to explore the celestial wonders that adorn the heavens.

The Moon

Throughout October, the Moon gracefully transitions through its phases, illuminating the night sky with its radiant presence. On October 1st, a waxing crescent Moon emerges, gradually growing brighter each night. By the 9th, a first-quarter Moon graces the sky, and by 16th, a full Moon, known as the Hunter's Moon, rises. Finally, as the month concludes, a waning crescent Moon emerges, preparing for the next lunar cycle.

The Planets

Venus, the dazzling evening star, dominates the western sky after sunset, casting a brilliant glow. Mars, the red planet, rises in the east during the early evening hours, showcasing its distinct reddish hue. Jupiter and Saturn, the gas giants, grace the night sky, with Jupiter shining brightly in the southern sky, while Saturn follows closely behind.

Meteor Showers

October brings forth two notable meteor showers, providing an opportunity to witness shooting stars streaking across the night sky. The Draconids meteor shower, peaking around October 8th, emanates from the



constellation Draco. Although it is a relatively minor shower, it occasionally surprises observers with an outburst of activity. Later in the month, the Orionids meteor shower, originating from the debris of Halley's Comet, reaches its peak around October 21st. With its fast-moving meteors, this shower promises a captivating display for those who venture out to witness it.

The council considered their initial response to the recent planning application for 205 houses on land at Penn Hill, the council is opposed to the application and will be providing their response to Wiltshire Council.

We continue to refer items to the Parish Steward for him to do on our behalf. If you notice a small highway issue that can be mended by our 'man in a van' please feel free to get in touch and we can see if it's something the Parish Steward scheme can help with. If not, we can arrange to report it via the 'my wilts' app.

On Saturday 16th September we held our second Green Energy Event. We hope that you were able to attend and found it helpful to get hints and tips on how to make your home more energy efficient

and reduce your energy bills.

Representatives from the council remain heavily involved and committed to the Calne Community Neighbourhood Plan review process. A neighbourhood plan is a document that sets out how and where development should occur in the locality, it is a plan developed by Calne Town Council, Calne Without Parish Council and representatives of the community. The review process is edging towards a consultation stage so please keep an eye on www.calnecommunityplan.com for up-to-date information.

Wiltshire Council have recently launched their Local Plan Consultation. There will be a consultation event in Calne Library on Monday 16th October 2023 between 3pm -7pm, there is also an online event on Tuesday 10th October 2023 starting at 6.30pm, further details will be posted on our website and social media. Wiltshire Council are proposing a large amount of housing in the Calne area within this plan,

this consultation is your opportunity to have your say in the future of housing policy.

Wiltshire's Local Plan Review Update: What it means for you and the Calne Community Neighbourhood Plan



Consultation for the Wiltshire Local Plan begins on Wednesday 27 September 2023 and runs until the 22^{nd of} November 2023.

Drop in events where you can talk to officers and find out more are being held across the County including ones at:

- Chippenham on Tuesday 3rd October 3pm to 7pm at Olympiad Leisure Centre, Sadlers Mead, Chippenham SN15 3PA.
- Calne on Monday 16th October 3pm to 7pm at Calne Library, The Strand, Calne SN11 0JU.

A webinar is also being held on Tuesday 10th October 2023, sign up on www.wiltshire.gov.uk search Wiltshire Local Plan.

The Wiltshire Local Plan covers a wide range of issues when thinking about development up to 2038, including:

- Housing, Employment and Infrastructure growth
- Protection of the Natural and Built Environment
- Response to Climate Change

Once adopted, all planning applications will be determined against the plan, making it the most important place-shaping document for Wiltshire.

What does it mean for the Calne Community Neighbourhood Plan?

Revisions to the Calne Community Neighbourhood Plan mean that it will also be looking ahead to 2038 to shape and inform development and conservation.

The policies we set must be in line with the Wiltshire Local Plan, so it is important that you look to see how it will affect you and let Wiltshire Council know what you think.

Private Samuel Beer of Studley

Private Samuel Beer, 6th Battalion Royal Munster Fusiliers, died of acute gastroenteritis on the island of Lemnos in Greece on 1st August 1915. His name is inscribed on the Derry Hill war memorial. Samuel is buried in Portianos Military Cemetery on Lemnos. He was the 23-year-old son of Frederick George and Thirza Beer, of Studley. Photo is of Samuel and Thirza Beer




On the 4th August 1915, Second Lieutenant Henry Maurice Chambers, his platoon commander, wrote to his mother - Thirza Beer: "Dear Mrs. Beer, it is with deep regret that I have to inform you that Private Beer, of my Platoon, died on Sunday. For eleven months I knew him, and he was always most anxious to become an efficient soldier. He was much beloved by his comrades and esteemed by his officers, while his record in the Regiment was blameless. Everyone considers it is very sad that your son should have been taken away from us so soon before the Regiment goes into action. He passed away on Sunday morning, and was buried the same afternoon, being accorded full military honours. His remains were played to the graveside by the Regimental band, where the Regimental buglers sounded the "Last Post," and his comrades fired three volleys over his body. Everything has been done to beautify his grave, while a cross, stating his name, regiment, age, and date of death, has been erected to his memory. It is forbidden to tell you his place of burial but be assured that as long as the Regiment remains here everything possible will be done to keep the grave as I know you would wish it to be kept. Believe me, all his comrades and officers have the utmost sympathy with you in your great sorrow".

The letter was printed in the Wiltshire Telegraph on 28th August 1915.

This September Robin Collyer (Studley) and Steve Calder (Derry Hill) took the opportunity to visit Samuel's grave at the Portianos

Military Cemetery, 108 years Samuel's passing after grave is regularly tended by the Commonwealth War Grave Commission - ensuring Second Lieutenant Chambers promise remains to be kept "everything possible will be done to keep the grave as I know you would wish it kept".

Frederick Beer died in February 1940 and Thirza died in March 1951. They are buried in Christ Church graveyard. Sadly, there is no marker for their final resting place.

We are currently recruiting 4 Church Foundation Governors to join our Governing Body.

The inclusion of foundation governors on the governing bodies of Voluntary Aided Church schools is one of the distinguishing characteristics of church school education. Our Christian Values are at the centre of everything we do at Derry Hill Primary School and we believe these Christian values empower our pupils to develop their spirituality and guide them in personal development as effective learners and good citizens.

At this time, we are looking to fill our foundation governor vacancies from individuals who are not related to any children within our school. Foundation governors can belong to a broad tapestry of Christian groups who are member Churches of 'Churches Together in Britain and Ireland' (CTBI) https://ctbi.org.uk/member-churches/

The role of a School Governing Body is:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction.
- Holding senior leaders to account for the educational performance of the organisation, its pupils, and the performance management of staff.
- Overseeing the financial performance of the organisation and making sure its money is well spent.

Foundation governors have additional responsibility as representatives of the church's role in the school, and must fully support, cherish, preserve and develop the distinctive Anglican and Christian ethos of the school. Ensuring also that the school has a distinctive Anglican and Christian vision and values which lead to effective practice and outcomes whilst striving to preserve and strengthen the links between church, school and Diocese.

Governors need a strong commitment to the role and to improving outcomes for children, the inquisitiveness to question and analyse, and the willingness to learn. You will work alongside the other categories of governors and the Senior Leadership Team to support governance across the school.

If you join our governing body, you will serve for a four-year term. Being a governor does take up time. There are five full governing body meetings each year, these are currently held at 6pm on Thursday evenings in school. As part of the Governing Body you will need to set aside time to prepare for these meetings, school monitoring activities and undertaking training/updates. We offer new governors a supportive induction and a mentor. Full training for the role is also provided via the Local Authority and Salisbury Diocese.

Local News

Recently, a small group of youths have been loitering, littering, causing criminal damage to a mature beech tree, spraying graffiti on a boundary fence and on one occasion been abusive towards a dog walker in Studley Gardens.

Police patrols have been increased in the area in response to this matter. We have been examining CCTV footage provided to us as part of the ongoing investigation.

We will also be working with the estate Management to address the boundary foliage to prevent this location being used as a meeting spot and location where Anti-social Behaviour is occurring.

Have You Swallowed A Battery Recently?

Around 3,500 Americans swallow batteries every year, according to the US National Poison Centre. Its apparently such a common problem that there's even a specific hotline dedicated for such an emergency.



A team of researchers at the Italian Institute of Technology in Genoa recently unveiled what is billed as the world's first fully rechargeable, edible battery. The new device uses riboflavin (often found in shitake mushrooms) as its anode and quercetin (seen in capers) as the cathode. Activated charcoal amplified the electrical conductivity alongside a water-based electrolyte. Nori seaweed (seen in sushi) served as the short circuit prevention separator, while beeswaxencased electrodes and food grade gold foil contacts also contributed to the design.



Edible batteries could help power medical devices inside the body for gastrointestinal tract monitoring and could also be a safe alternative to toxic children's toy batteries.

Please be aware that due to preserving the biodiversity at Hazeland there are no hardstanding paths and we are not able to allow dogs on site (except assistance dogs).



Sparrowhawk meditation

To live surrounded by nature is a privilege, and one I don't take for granted. It feels extra special when animals — deer and hares in particular, as well as countless birds—come up close to their human neighbours.

Recently, this particular bird came calling: a female sparrowhawk. She was striking in every sense: strong, watchful and beautiful. I'd never seen



one in such detail before and was curious to read about her.

The Eurasian sparrowhawk, also known as *Accipiter nisus*, is a modestly sized bird of prey. They live in woodland and hunt smaller birds. Used in falconry, they've featured in poems, myths and stories from many cultures.

The sparrowhawk, small and fierce, is said to represent a warrior's inner spirit, complete with a clear-sighted ability to see the whole picture. A simple meditation on these qualities can be uplifting and energising.

Sit somewhere quietly. Take relaxed, even breaths. Then close your eyes and focus with your thoughts on the sparrowhawk's characteristics – whatever comes to mind. You might think of its striped feathers and far-seeing eyes, you might think of its beauty, boldness and strength.

As you continue to breathe in and out, be aware that those qualities are also within you. Feel a purposeful power filling the whole of your being. Enjoy that sense of strength; truly own it. And when you're ready, open your eyes.

The message of the sparrowhawk ultimately comes down to this: you are stronger and more able than you think.




