# **Annie's November Notes**



Well, it's hard to believe that it's November already. I just don't know where this year has gone! Isn't it amazing that the older one gets the quicker the time seems to go? Or is it just me?!!! November sees the weather getting colder and the days getting shorter so don't forget those who live alone and struggle to get out and about. We should also remember the little birds who need extra food at this time of year and throughout the winter, to keep them going until spring.

November is the month of remembrance with All Saints Day on the 1<sup>st</sup> and All Souls Day on the 2<sup>nd</sup>. On the 12<sup>th</sup> November we will remember the war dead at our services of Remembrance and there will be a service of Remembrance for the residents of Kingston House too. It is amazing to listen to the stories of those who remember these difficult times and it is by listening to their stories and retell them too so that the sacrifice made by so many is never forgotten. The four weeks of November are often called the 'Kingdom Season' in the Church calendar and it is a time where we seek the glory of Christ's Kingdom. The Kingdom Season is a time for forgiveness, reconciliation and healing. Is there someone in your life who deserves forgiveness, reconciliation or healing, someone you can help to achieve inner peace? The season concludes with the triumphant Feast of Christ the King who will reign over all things in the peaceable Kingdom of God.

This 'quiet time' sets the scene for the season of Advent which, this year begins on the 3<sup>rd</sup> December – more about that next month! In the meantime, perhaps we can all try to find some time this month for some rest – have a go at spending just 5 minutes a day quietly with God. If you do this, I guarantee that you will benefit from it, just sit quietly, say a little prayer or read some scripture – you might be pleasantly surprised where it takes you! I'm sure that December and the run up to Christmas will be hectic, so make the most of November!

Also, please continue to enjoy the wonders of God's amazing creation as you watch the seasons change, appreciate the colours you see all around you and the sounds of the garden birds. # The Sky at Night

In the United Kingdom, the sky at night in November offers a good experience for stargazers. As the autumn season progresses, the nights grow longer, providing ample time to explore the celestial wonders above.

One of the most prominent features of the November sky is the constellation of Orion. This mighty hunter dominates the southern sky,



easily recognizable by his distinctive belt of three bright stars. Betelgeuse, one of Orion's shoulders, shines with a reddish hue, while Rigel, his foot, emits a brilliant blue-white light. The constellation's other stars, such as Bellatrix and Saiph, complete the celestial figure, captivating observers with their beauty and mythology.

As the month progresses, the Pleiades star cluster, also known as the Seven Sisters, becomes more prominent in the eastern sky. This cluster, consisting of several young, hot stars, forms a stunning sight resembling a tiny dipper. Its ethereal glow and delicate arrangement make it a favourite among stargazers.

November also offers a chance to witness the Taurid meteor shower. Although not as well-known as other meteor showers, the Taurids are known for producing bright fireballs that streak across the sky. Originating from the constellation Taurus, these meteors can be seen throughout the month, with peak activity occurring around mid-November. Finding a dark location away from city lights will enhance the chances of spotting these shooting stars. In the western sky, the planet Venus shines brightly as the evening star. Its radiant glow outshines all other celestial objects, making it impossible to miss. Venus can be observed shortly after sunset, casting a mesmerizing light over the horizon.

Jupiter and Saturn also make their appearance in

the November sky. These gas giants can be found in the south eastern sky, with Jupiter being the brighter of the two. With a telescope, you can marvel at Jupiter's distinct cloud bands and its four largest moons, known as the Galilean moons.

So, whether you are an avid stargazer or simply curious about the mysteries of the universe, the sky at night during November promises a captivating display of constellations, planets, and meteor showers. Take a moment to step outside, look up, and let the beauty of the cosmos ignite your imagination.

#### What we've been doing in the last month;

There is always lots going on here at Calne Without Parish Council. We continue to ensure that we represent the local residents and respond to planning applications.

During this last month we held our Green Energy event day, it was great to see so many residents looking for ways to help reduce the impact of their homes on the local environment. Thank you to all who attended and those who exhibited. At this event our Plant a Tree scheme was launched and we are so happy to see so many people request their free trees and be part of the scheme, if you have requested a tree, you will be contacted soon to arrange collection once we receive them.

Wiltshire Council have recently launched their Local Plan Consultation. The closing date for you to have your say is Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> November. Further details have been posted on our website and social media. Wiltshire Council are proposing a large amount of housing in the Calne area within this plan, this consultation is your opportunity to have your say in the future of housing policy.

We continue to carry out improvement works to local public rights of way. If you regularly walk the public footpaths located in Calne without and have noted any issues that we might be able to assist with, please get in touch and we can see if we are able to help.

Last year we purchased two thermal imaging cameras and loaned them to residents of Calne Without Parish Council to help them identify areas in their houses where there are areas of improvement in relation to insulation and heat loss. Once the average temperature falls below 10°C we will be ready to start loaning out the cameras again. Please get in touch if you wish to put your name on the waiting list for one of the cameras.

#### **Reporting issues**

We regularly receive reports of work required that we pass onto Wiltshire Council for their attention. Did you know that there is a quick and easy way to report items such as potholes and issues with street lighting straight to Wiltshire Council? Search 'my wilts' app and follow the instructions. Once you have set up an account reporting is quick and simple.

Consultation for the Wiltshire Local Plan runs until the 22<sup>nd</sup> of November 2023.

The Wiltshire Local Plan covers a wide range of issues when thinking about development up to 2038, including:

- Housing, Employment and Infrastructure growth
- Protection of the Natural and Built Environment
- Response to Climate Change

Once adopted, all planning applications will be determined against the plan, making it the most important place-shaping document for Wiltshire.

# What does it mean for the Calne Community Neighbourhood Plan?

Revisions to the Calne Community Neighbourhood Plan mean that it will also be looking ahead to 2038 to shape and inform development and conservation.

The policies we set must be in line with the Wiltshire Local Plan, so it is important that you look to see how it will affect you and let Wiltshire Council know what you think.

# **The Cleverly Boys**

Just over 100 years ago, 40 Church Road, Derry Hill was the home of the William and Sarah Cleverly and their family. WW1 took two of the Cleverly boys - both commemorated on the Derry Hill war memorial.

**On 31<sup>st</sup> October 1914 Alfred Cleverly** was killed in action in France. Alfred was a Private in the Wiltshire Regiment 1st Battalion and died on 31 October 1914. He is commemorated at Le Touret Memorial Panel 33a.

**On the 25<sup>th</sup> April 1917 Frederick Cleverly** was killed in action in Greece. He was a Private in the Wiltshire Regiment and is buried at Sarigol Military Cemetery, Kriston, Greece.

40 Church Road has hardly changed over the past 100 years. It is quite easy to imagine the two days in 1914 and 1917 when the post brought the very worst messages in brown envelopes from the War Office.

The inclusion of foundation governors on the governing bodies of Voluntary Aided Church schools is one of the distinguishing characteristics of church school education. Our Christian Values are at the centre of everything we do at Derry Hill Primary School and we believe these Christian values empower our pupils to develop their spirituality and guide them in personal development as effective learners and good citizens.

At this time, we are looking to fill our foundation governor vacancies from individuals who are not related to any children within our school. Foundation governors can belong to a broad tapestry of Christian groups who are member Churches of 'Churches Together in Britain and Ireland' (CTBI) <u>https://ctbi.org.uk/member-churches/</u>

The role of a School Governing Body is:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction.
- Holding senior leaders to account for the educational performance of the organisation, its pupils, and the performance management of staff.
- Overseeing the financial performance of the organisation and making sure its money is well spent.

Foundation governors have additional responsibility as representatives of the church's role in the school, and must fully support, cherish, preserve and develop the distinctive Anglican and Christian ethos of the school. Ensuring also that the school has a distinctive Anglican and Christian vision and values which lead to effective practice and outcomes whilst striving to preserve and strengthen the links between church, school and Diocese.

Governors need a strong commitment to the role and to improving outcomes for children, the inquisitiveness to question and analyse, and the willingness to learn. You will work alongside the other categories of governors and the Senior Leadership Team to support governance across the school.

If you join our governing body, you will serve for a four-year term. Being a governor does take up time. There are five full governing body meetings each year, these are currently held at 6pm on Thursday evenings in school. As part of the Governing Body you will need to set aside time to prepare for these meetings, school monitoring activities and undertaking training/updates. We offer new governors a supportive induction and a mentor. Full training for the role is also provided via the Local Authority and Salisbury Diocese.

#### Do You Know How to Give CPR?

If you see a person in cardiac arrest, call 999 immediately and start CPR. You will be told what to do by the 999 operator while you wait for an ambulance or paramedic to arrive.



You don't need to be qualified to do CPR, you are trying to save a life!

#### How to do CPR on an adult in 5 steps

- 1. Check for a response. Firmly shake the person's shoulders and loudly ask if they're okay.
- 2. Call 999. If the person is unconscious and not breathing, or not breathing normally, start CPR.
- 3. If there is someone with you, ask them to find a defibrillator.
- 4. Start chest compressions. With the heel of your hand in the centre of their chest, press down smoothly and firmly at a rate of 2 per second. Try pushing to the beat of Stayin' Alive by the Bee Gees.
- 5. Use a defibrillator as soon as you can. Follow its instructions carefully while you continue CPR.



#### **Book Club Review**

#### West With Giraffes by Lynda Rutledge

"West With Giraffes" is a bittersweet comingof-age novel which celebrates hope over adversity. As well as being based on a true story, the novel is a story of adventure and unrequited love.

After 17-year-old Woodrow Wilson Nickel buried the last of his family, he struck out from his home in the Texas Dust Bowl to find his cousin in New York City. It was 1938, the US was in the throes of the Great Depression and war was looming in Europe.



Now, at the age of 105, Woody is in a care home, reflecting upon his life. He is enraged by seeing a television news article reporting the near extinction of giraffes, which played such a major part in his youth. He begins to write a journal of an eventful trip he took across the US with a pair of giraffes many years earlier.

The San Diego Zoo, had managed to procure two giraffes from Africa. As their transport ship neared New York City it was nearly sunk by a ferocious hurricane. The giraffes somehow survived and were placed into quarantine before their long road trip to California. It is here that the orphaned Woody encountered them and despite only being 17 and without any experience he secured the job of driving their transport truck on the long trip to San Diego.

The novel is beautifully written and has a real mixture of everything in it-love, intrigue, and redemption, all set against a tale of two graceful giraffes. There was a lot for us to discuss. I would recommend this book; I thoroughly enjoyed it!

It was described as a combination of Dexter (a character that even you know is wrong but you can't help but champion) and 'Made in Chelsea' (privileged and somewhat ridiculous). However, it was agreed that the characters were shallow and superficial and the modern twist of influencers / social media did not justify how unlikeable they were.



In my experience, rarely has a book elicited such strong and open conversations. Conversations that explored the society in which we live and the differences across generations. Some topics discussed were both uncomfortable and challenging but nevertheless insightful. Or more mischievously, should your partner be concerned if they found you reading this book after having an argument.

The general consensus from the group was that this is not a good book, but it is a good book club book.






