Annie's notes

Welcome to February when our thoughts turn to love!! Although the weather may be cold, love can always keep us warm. Of course, in the secular world, the focus of love in February is St Valentine's Day. The first official Saint Valentine's Day was declared on 14th of February by



Pope Galasius in 496, in memory of a 3rd century martyred priest in Rome. It is believed that the young priest rose to distinction after betraying Emperor Claudius in 270 AD by conducting illegitimate wedding ceremonies in the capital. Emperor Claudius claimed that married men made poor soldiers and consequently decreed that all marriages of younger citizens would be outlawed. Bishop Valentine, however, maintained that marriage was part of God's plan and purpose for the world. He continued to conduct marriages in secret between young people, sometimes as young as twelve, in the name of love.

His success gained him unwelcome notoriety, which became Bishop Valentine's downfall. He was jailed and ultimately beheaded, but not before he fell in love with the jailer's daughter. It is thought that on the evening of his execution the bishop passed her a note which read "from your Valentine". This story has blossomed into the defining tradition of Valentine's Day.

Shrove Tuesday comes on the 13th February this year, and is the last chance to indulge yourself, and to use up the foods that aren't allowed in Lent. Pancakes are eaten on this day because they contain fat, butter and eggs which were forbidden during Lent. On Shrove Tuesday, in the Middle Ages, people used to confess their sins so that they were forgiven before the season of Lent began. So, Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, the 14th, Ash Wednesday is a Christian festival. It marks the beginning of six and a half weeks of repentance, fasting and abstinence in preparation for the most important Christian festival of <u>Easter</u>. Many Christians will attend a religious service where the ashes are blessed by the priest and placed on their forehead. Christians often give something up for Lent, like chocolate or alcohol, or sometimes even take something up, like reading the Bible or taking time for prayer every day.

As always, in the cold weather, please remember to show some love to our neighbours, particularly the elderly and infirm, to make sure they have all they need and are ok. Share the love!!! With every blessing from

Rector's notes

Easter falls early in 2024 (on 31st March), and that means Lent begins with Ash Wednesday in the middle of this month - on 14th February. So, you could choose to take your nearest and dearest out to a Valentine's meal with a big ash cross on your forehead!

The season of Lent actually has quite a lot going on in it.

Traditionally it's a time of self-examination and penitence, and the concept of giving something up for Lent relates to *self-denial*, of course. But also during Lent, in the story of Jesus' own life there is the dramatic turn to the cross and the intensity for us of reliving the Passion of Christ in Holy Week, and our own consideration of what discipleship might cost us. In between – this year it falls on Sunday 10th March – is Mothering Sunday; celebrating our mothers whether they have died or are still with us, and paying attention too to those among us for whom the whole issue of motherhood is difficult.

One of the characteristic features of the world we inhabit is how relentless is the pace of life and the flow of information from every direction. Most of us are almost instantly connected with the world all the time. I remember when my daughter was a teenager, on one occasion being full of anguish because her best friend hadn't replied to a message. 'When did you send it?' I asked. She looked at her phone. '17 minutes ago!'

We all surely benefit from a conscious disconnecting from the world from time to time, and if it feels like we haven't done that for a while, what better time than Lent (or whenever you might happen to be reading this)? 'What's keeping you busy?' is quite a useful question to ask ourselves; 'Which of those busy things really matters?' might be a helpful follow up, because it's possible to spend a lot of our time busy with things that in the end are not that important. I hope this Lent might offer you a moment to reflect on which are the really important things for you, and to appreciate them in a fresh way.



The Sky at night


The sky at night in February in the UK offers a captivating celestial display. As the winter season continues, the nights are longer, providing ample opportunities for stargazing and observing the wonders of the universe.

One of the highlights of the sky February is constellation of Orion. which dominates the southern sky. Orion is easily recognizable by its distinctive shape, resembling a hunter with a belt of three bright stars. Within Orion, you can find the famous Orion Nebula. a



stellar nursery where new stars are born. With a pair of binoculars or a small telescope, you can witness the intricate details of this stunning nebula.

Another prominent feature of the February sky is the Pleiades star cluster, also known as the Seven Sisters. Located in the constellation of Taurus, the Pleiades is a beautiful cluster of blue stars that can be seen with the naked eye. It is best observed in a dark sky away from city lights.





In the early hours of the morning, the planet Venus shines brightly in the eastern sky. Venus is often referred to as the "Morning Star" and is the second brightest object in the night sky after the Moon. Its dazzling appearance adds a touch of beauty to the pre-dawn sky.

February also offers a chance to witness the elusive phenomenon known as the Zodiacal Light. This faint glow of sunlight scattered by interplanetary dust can be seen in the western sky after sunset or in the eastern sky before sunrise. It appears as a pyramidshaped glow extending from the horizon.

So, grab a warm coat, a telescope or binoculars, and immerse yourself in the awe-inspiring beauty of the universe.

What we've been doing in the last month;

There continues to be lots going on here at Calne Without Parish Council. We continue to ensure that we represent the local residents and respond to planning applications. Just before Christmas we distributed all the trees that had been requested as part of our 'free tree scheme'. If you received a tree as part of the scheme, we'd love to see pictures of where you have planted it and maybe receive regular updates over the years as it grows. In total we distributed 137 trees.



As the weather is colder, we are once again loaning out our thermal imaging cameras for use in your homes. These cameras help residents identify areas in their houses where heat may be escaping allowing them to make informed decisions about thermal improvements in the property. Please get in touch if you wish to put your name on the waiting list to loan one of the cameras. At the time of writing, the waiting list is not very long so you could have the camera sooner than you think!

You will see in another article that the Calne Community Neighbourhood plan is currently out for consultation. Our parish councillors have been heavily involved in getting the revised plan to this stage so please make sure you take a look and have your say.

The Lysley Family

In 1832 William John Lysley (MP for Chippenham between 1859 and 1865) bought the Pewsham Estate – land that included Little, Middle and Great Lodge Farms and extended to the A4, where the Pewsham (Lysley Arms) public house stands.

William Lysley lived in Great Lodge Farm – just behind the Pewsham Garage – with his wife Caroline. They had four children; Caroline, Sarah, William Gerard and Warine.




William Gerard inherited the Pewsham Estate in 1873, passing it to Frances Lysley (his wife) in 1887. Frances built Pewsham House in 1892.

This Lysley Dynasty lie under the East window of Christ Church.



The East window, illustrating the Ascension of Our Lord, was erected in 1865 in memory of Caroline by William John Lysley.



Calne Neighbourhood Policing Team Update

Crime and incident updates

- On 23/12/2023 at 17:40hrs, a blue Silver Mercedes Sprinter van was seized by police on the A361. The driver was also reported for not having an MOT or valid insurance policy.
- On 12/01/2024 at 12:46hrs, a blue Toyota Aygo was travelling too fast around a bend in Tytherton Lucas almost colliding with a police vehicle. The driver was stopped and reported for careless driving.
- On 13/01/2024 at 11:01hrs, we received a report of a two-vehicle road traffic collision on the A4 in Derry Hill near to the pedestrian crossing. Thankfully all drivers and passengers were uninjured. Police remained at the location to direct traffic until the damaged vehicles could be removed from the road.
- On 13/01/2024 at 19:00hrs, an unknown vehicle collided with a boundary fence in Fishers Brook causing damage. The driver did not stop or leave their details at the scene.
- At 14:53hrs, we received a further report of a road traffic collision on the A4 at Chilvester Hill. This collision involved five vehicles. Thankfully, all drivers and passenger were uninjured. Officers remained at the scene until the vehicles were cleared from road.

Driving in adverse weather conditions. We are responding to ever higher numbers of vehicle collisions during this time of year.

We urge drivers to take extra care on the roads around Wiltshire, with ice, snow and flooding in some areas leading to hazardous conditions.



Please avoid unnecessary journeys and if you must drive, reduce your speed - it can take 10 times longer to stop in icy conditions, and do not attempt to drive through deep flooded routes.

Always ensure all windows, any snow-covered surfaces are clear before moving off. The Highway Code provides more information about driving in adverse weather conditions.



Cyclists, please ensure that you have sufficient reflective clothing and appropriate lighting when riding your bike at this time of year.

We are receiving several reports of cyclists wearing dark clothing and not being visible in our area.

This also includes children travelling to

and from school. Our evenings are slowly getting lighter, but please be mindful of this as we move through the darker mornings.

We will be looking to stop and offer advice to cyclists seen over the coming weeks to try to keep everyone safer on our roads.



Book Club Review

Olive Kitteridge by Elizabeth Strout

Elizabeth Strout's 2009 Pulitzer Prize winning novel, set in the 1980's, is a collection of short stories based around the coastal town of Crosby, Maine, detailing the residents' lives and problems, held together by the central, larger than life character of retired schoolteacher Olive Kitteridge.



A sharp, impatient, and difficult woman, Olive struggles to make sense of the changes in her life and her connections with others. She's a woman you may begin the book hating and her callousness towards her son and husband, combined with her thoughtless exasperation with those she encounters, is almost unbearable to read. There's humour – but it's dark. The group chuckled at Olive as reluctant supper hostess serving baked beans, rolls and vanilla ice cream; and stealing one shoe from her daughter-in-law's favourite pair after hearing her less than kind comments about Olive's homemade mother-of-the-bride dress

Beautifully written and deeply moving, the group felt it was 'spread too thinly' and 'bitty' – learning that many of the thirteen chapters were published separately and that the book has been called 'a novel in stories' was an 'Aha' moment. For me, it was an accurate depiction of the closeness and remoteness found within small communities wherein the emergence of several key characters, like Olive, play a more crucial role in the lives of those around them than they'll ever know.





Wellbeing notes

Banana bread (traybake version)

There's something about February. The land is just beginning to warm up, the days are becoming longer. snowdrops and the and aconites in Lacock Abbey gardens are splashing the ground with beauty. After a bracing walk outdoors, it's the perfect time to enjoy simple home comforts - including. very possibly, some easy baking.



One of my family's favourite everyday recipes is banana bread. The version we like best comes from <u>BBC Good Food</u>. All you need is 140g each of butter, sugar and self-raising flour, two eggs, one teaspoon of baking powder and – of course – a couple of very ripe, mashed bananas.

Instead of the caster sugar that the BBC recipe calls for, we make use of whatever sugar is in the kitchen: granulated, or perhaps soft brown. We've discarded the old loaf tin in favour of a silicon, traybake mould $-18 \text{cm} \times 18 \text{cm}$ — which bakes quicker. When it's out of the oven we drizzle it with around 70g icing sugar dissolved in a few teaspoons of water. And, as soon as it's cool enough, we cut it into springy, fragrant squares roughly the size of a cupcake. There should have been more slices to include in this illustrative photo, but half of them were eaten straight away!

Banana bread is a great example of kitchen therapy – simple dishes, made mindfully, can be hugely soothing to the cook. The traybake pictured here was made during stormy weather, and the contrast between howling winds outside and cosy domesticity indoors is something to be cherished.




