

Sarah and her family will be living in the vicarage at Derry Hill, and she will work on Sundays and three other days of each week. But Sarah and I will both work across all the churches, rather than keep to



our own separate areas. She will be licensed by

Bishop Stephen at 3pm on Sunday 16th June at Christchurch, Derry Hill. Sarah writes:

Anything Can Happen. Anyone Can Help!

Are you able to help if the person next to you collapses to the floor?

Sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) claims the lives of over 30,000 people a year in the UK.



Waiting for emergency services gives a cardiac arrest victim only a 5% chance of survival. But, if bystanders immediately administer and maintain cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and use an automated external defibrillator (AED) while waiting for emergency services to arrive, then the chances of survival increase up to 60%

We have installed 6 defibrillators in the village – do you know where they are and how to use one? Can we show you?

There is a free Defib and CPR training session from our own Derry Hill and Studley village NHS paramedic at the Lansdowne Hall at 7.30pm on 27th March.

The Rev. Christopher Rutledge

The 13th Vicar of Derry Hill was the Rev. Christopher J. F. Rutledge.

Born in December 1944, the Rev. Rutledge was ordained in 1970 and went to Calne in 1973. Became vicar of Derry Hill on 8th April 1976. He played for Calne Rugby and moved to Bournemouth in 1981.

After 40 years' service to the community, the Rev Canon Dr Christopher Rutledge retired in 2010. Two articles in the press at his time:

Barrel holds up project

For want of a suitable barrel, a major Church redecoration project at Derry Hill will not go ahead until mid-January. Then the Rev. Christopher Rutledge will call on his parishioners to paint the interior of Christ Church.

The Rev. Rutledge may have the help of army officer cadets from Sandhurst who are in the area on a community project.

But of prime importance is to get a suitable barrel, so that an old-fashioned mixture of lump lime and tallow, which was used successfully some years ago to cover the exterior of the 300year old Calne Alms houses, will be allowed to mature for two weeks. Until the maturing process is completed redecoration work cannot begin. Then before the mixture can be applied, it will be necessary for all the walls to be cleaned thoroughly with damp sponges.

The Rev. Rutledge said "The barrel we got hold of is not suitable, but we are now on the track of another one 10 people volunteered their services when they knew we were going to carry out the work and I know there will be many more when the starting date is announced, probably in mid-January"

The Sky at night



One of the highlights of the March night sky is the presence of the Orion constellation. Dominating the southern sky, Orion is easily recognizable with its distinctive pattern of stars forming the shape of a hunter. Within Orion, stargazers can marvel at the famous Orion Nebula, a stellar nursery where new stars are born amidst colourful clouds of gas and dust.

Mars, the red planet, also graces the March night sky, shining brightly as it reaches its closest approach to Earth. Observing Mars through a telescope reveals its rusty surface features and polar ice caps, offering a glimpse into the mysteries of our neighbouring planet. Jupiter and Saturn are two other prominent planets visible in the March night sky. Jupiter, with its mesmerizing bands of clouds and four largest moons, and Saturn, adorned with its iconic rings, provide celestial delights for amateur astronomers and sky watchers.

In addition to these celestial wonders, March often brings with it the mesmerizing dance of the Moon and the planets. Observing the waxing and waning phases of the Moon as it moves in proximity to Jupiter, Saturn, and Mars creates a stunning visual display that is bound to inspire awe and wonder.

Grab your telescope, set up your stargazing gear, and immerse yourself in the beauty of the night sky this March.

Calne Foodbank

Calne Foodbank offers short-term help to all who are facing difficulties.

Their main goal is to provide a food parcel that contains



enough items to sustain an individual, a couple or a family for three days. By doing this, they hope to take away the short-term worry and stress of having food, allowing people to focus on resolving their problems with the help of other agencies.

At present 227 households are registered with the foodbank. Calne Foodbank is an independent charity relying on grants and the goodwill of the community for support. It is run completely by a dedicated team of volunteers.

Whilst they supply the food parcels, they work closely with established agencies who are experienced in identifying those in need. These agencies play a vital role in connecting the foodbank with individuals or families who require assistance, ensuring that the food parcels reach the right people at the right time.

The Foodbank offers food parcels for individuals, couples and families.

In particular they are looking for donations of: tinned meat, tinned veg, rice pudding, custard, pasta sauce and cereal bars. (Please make sure your donations are in date).

You don't need to take your donations down to Calne, there is a weekly collection from Christ Church in Derry Hill – there's a collection point in the porch on the left as you go in.

They are happy to accept monetary donations and support from local businesses.


Book Club Review

Still Life by Sarah Winman

This beautiful book was very well received by most of our group. It is really about the friendships that we make throughout our lives, sometimes in the most unlikely situations.

Ulysses Temper is a young British soldier serving in Italy towards the end of the Second World War when he meets elderly Evelyn Skinner, an art historian.

He returns to the East End of London after the war and we meet the wonderful group of characters who eventually all find their way to the palazzo in Florence which Ulysses has inherited.



Although not plot driven, the narrative goes all the way from the 1940s to the late 60s and cleverly uses the news events of each era as a backdrop.

So we witness the tearing down of the slums in the East End and the great flood of Florence in 1966, vividly portrayed that you can really imagine the smell of it. There are glorious descriptions of Florence, of the Tuscan countryside and an Italian island contrasted with the drabness of post war Britain and the colourful East End pub, the Stoat and Parrot.

However, it is the characters which make this book stand out. Evelyn is erudite and Bohemian, the Londoners are raucous and funny and the Italians so wonderfully eccentric. There is a lot of warmth and humour in this book which is why I recommended it. The few criticisms were of some implausibility, the length of time it took to reconnect Ulysses and Evelyn and the rather protracted and unnecessary ending.
