

Rector's notes for April - new life and new hope for the Church

I can't be the only one for whom this time of year is the best. On top of this being Easter season for the next six Sundays, with all the joy and hope of Jesus' resurrection life to celebrate and ponder, we have these great visual reminders of new life all around us, as life in the fields, hedgerows and our gardens begins to burst into life again.



New resurrection life is one of Christianity's most distinctive features, and we hope our churches embody it in some way all the year round. Jesus has risen from the dead, and so paves the way for resurrection life for all whose life on this earth comes to an end.

But before that, there is this life to be lived, with all its opportunities and challenges! The Herbert-Smiths of Buckhill, Bowood

Henry Herbert Smith was the Agent to Bowood Estate for 40 years. Henry and his wife Emily had 3 children - Cyril, Dorothy, Violet. The three grew up at Buckhill House on Bowood Estate. Henry died in 1913. Today Henry and Emily lie under a large white cross in the graveyard of Christ Church. Inside the church on the North Wall just next to the John Spencer window is a blue tile plague to the memory of Henry.



Cyril went on to be a Captain in the Gloucestershire Regiment and an architect. For most of his life he was associated with the firm Messrs. Smith and Marshall of St Mary's Street Chippenham. He was also



agent to several estates including the Marguess of Crewe. Those of us who travel through Calne pass three buildings closely associated with Cyril -Chilvester Hill House (his home for many years), the two red bricked semidetached cottages on Chilvester Hill (he was the architect) and the Calne Heritage Centre (former library - he was the architect). Cyril was a keen rider to the hounds with the Duke of Beaufort, a good shot and fond of fishing. A great lover of dogs, he was seldom seen without one - usually of the retriever type. For many years he was the Chairman of the Calne Without

Parish Council. Cyril lies with his wife and parents in Christ Church graveyard, Derry Hill.

Dorothy went on to marry Major Marriot Smith. The paper of the day describes their wedding day:

"The church was filled with friends and the men of the 121st Battery, stationed at Trowbridge, lined the aisle. The floral decorations were very choice. The bride who was given away by her father wore a gown of rich white Duchesse satin arranged with pearl embroidery and old Limerick lace. Following the ceremony, a reception was held at

Buckhill House, in a large marquee on the lawn, the band of the Wilts Regiment being in attendance and supplying music".

Violet Herbert Smith was born in 1884 and died in 1964. Like her brother, Violet was a keen rider. Violet went on to marry Ronald Carrington. Brigadier Ronald Carrington died on 10th December 1948 in Biddestone. Violet was the president of the Chippenham Women's Section British Legion and for many years a member of the executive committee of the Chippenham Conservative Association. They had two daughters - Diana and Mavis. They lived in a house called Frenchay in Biddestone. Violet



and Ronald share a grave marker in Biddestone. Violet was also a photographer and has left us with a glimpse into life in the early 20th Century at Bowood and Derry Hill.

If you have a loved one buried or interred in one of our churchyards perhaps you might like to think about making a donation towards the perpetual upkeep – it would be very gratefully received!

Our Family Service continues at Christ Church and is held on the first Sunday of the month. All are welcome to come along and support our children – and their parents – on their journey of faith. The Sky at night



In April the Lyrid meteor shower peaks mid-month, providing a chance to see shooting stars streaking across the sky.

As darkness falls this month, the constellation of Ursa Major (the Great Bear) can be seen climbing high in the southeast. Look out for the distinctive brighter stars that form the 'plough' or 'big dipper' – these stars make up the back and tail of the Bear.

Also, this month, Mercury reaches 'greatest elongation', that is it is furthest from the setting Sun and will be easier to spot low in the west around half an hour after the Sun sets.

Venus is also climbing higher into our evening skies. Have a look to the west around 11 April to see the brightest planet in the night sky as it appears to pass close to the Pleiades star cluster in the constellation of Taurus.

The Moon has a couple of conjunctions with the brighter planets this month. On 22-23 April, a 10% illuminated crescent moon will appear close to Venus (and the Pleiades), while the evening of 25 April will see a 30% illuminated Moon setting in the west near to Mars.

Calne Neighbourhood Policing Team Update

Crime and incident updates

On 03/03/2024 between 01:00 and 03:00hrs, Unknown suspect has knocked on door to property in Studley during the early hours of the morning, then 2 nights later someone was ringing on a doorbell causing some concern to the resident.

Driver charged with drink driving following a collision in Derry Hill.

Officers from Calne Neighbourhood Team and Roads Policing Unit attended the incident shortly before 10am on 24th February.

A red Citroen C1 had collided with a bush whilst travelling from Devizes towards Chippenham.



Gary Packer, 55, of no fixed address, Devizes, has since been charged with drink driving and is due to appear at Salisbury Magistrates Court on 15th March 2024.

A woman and man sadly died following two separate collisions near Calne.

At approximately 2.45pm on February 26, three vehicles – a Vauxhall Zafira, Dacia Sandero and a Nissan Juke - were involved in a collision on the A3102.

The driver of the Dacia, a woman in her 60s from Melksham, was airlifted to Southmead Hospital with life threatening injuries. Sadly, she died in hospital. Her family are aware and are being supported by a specially trained family liaison officer. Our thoughts are with them at this difficult time.

The road was closed between Calne and Sandy Lane while collision investigators attended the scene. It reopened at approximately 1am the following morning.

Any witnesses to the collision, or anyone who may have dash cam footage, should call the Serious Collision Investigation Team on 01225 694597 and quote log number 173 of February 26. Alternatively, email SCIT@wiltshire.police.uk

On 3rd March, a male motorcyclist in his 60s was taken to Southmead Hospital by air ambulance after the collision, but despite the best

efforts of medical staff he sadly died of his injuries. His next of kin have been informed and our thoughts are with them at this incredibly difficult time.

Vehicle caused damage to wall on A342 Old Derry Hill

Road safety

We are continuing to monitor any collisions or incidents on the A4 and surrounding routes of Derry Hill and will look to target those locations for preventive patrols and enforcement action where possible.

We are still seeing an increase in traffic on our rural roads due to a section of Dauncey, near Lyneham being closed. We will be paying particular attention to all routes including those in East Tytherton, Derry Hill, Bremhill and Foxham over coming weeks.

We have forwarded on reports of vehicles travelling at excessive speeds on the 60mph roads around the Derry Hill area and the 50/60mph on the A4 and towards Calne, Sandy Lane and Mile Elm to our Roads Policing Unit, who will also be looking to target this area in the coming weeks.

The Calne Neighbourhood Team are fully committed to keeping our roads as safe as possible and we will continue to conduct speed checks throughout our area.

Closed fishing season – 15th March to 15th 2024

The coarse fish close season is approaching at the time of writing this update) meaning it's illegal to fish for coarse fish in rivers until 15th June inclusive.

Don't forget, there are plenty of still waters or canal coarse fisheries where you can fish.

These rules are aimed at protecting fish stocks and making fisheries sustainable. Freshwater fish include salmon, trout, coarse fish and eels

Gardener's Question Time

March saw our Gardening Club assemble to put questions to a panel of experts. Our panel of experts were Capability Charlotte (www.capabilitycharlotte.com), Mary Baker from the Botanic Nursery, Atworth (www.thebotanicnursery.co.uk) and Marcel Floyd from Floyd Climbers (www.floydsclimbers.co.uk).

Amongst the questions were:

Question. I'm an organic gardener but am plagued with bindweed in my allotment. How, keeping to the spirit of organic gardening, can I deal with this weed?

Answer. Lots of careful digging using Hori Hori knife or a trowel. Every piece of root left in the soil will grow into a new plant so remove every bit carefully. It will take a few years. Alternatively cover area with cardboard to exclude light and leave.

Question. I have a Rebecca clematis which is currently planted in a shady area of the garden and does flower but has not been as expected. It said it would grow anywhere so would a sunny spot be better, and can I move it in spring? Also, would it benefit from well-rotted manure or another feed? I was thinking of growing it up a small pergola with a rose.

Answer. The Rebecca Clematis loves the sun and likes light. Can be moved early Spring. In April feed with potash (tomorite/rose feed/high potassium comfrey) and then once a week/fortnight until buds open then stop as soon as they start to flower. Once 1st flowers go over start feeding again.

Question. I suffer from black fly on my roses. How do I get rid of it? Is it about cutting the plant right back or application of specific spray? Help?

Answer. Don't cut down, pick off affected leaves, spray with rose clear or other similar spray. Make sure the soil is healthy and keep plant clean, encourage creatures that eat black fly such as ladybirds, hoverflies, wasps & earwigs) and be patient. Plant garlic round the rose. Check roses regularly from Spring onwards.




Book Club Review




Our trip to see Team Bath v London Pulse was a great night out. Unfortunately,






