

Rector's notes for May

May has always been my favourite month – I think it dates from my dairy farming days, when we could guarantee that the cows would be out grazing day and night (which always made the daily workload so much easier – self-propelled muck-spreaders, you understand). The days are still getting longer, the weather on average is getting warmer, and everything green is growing like crazy.

I confess I have never been much of a gardener in the past. But having a new vicarage garden in the middle of Calne right next to Abberd Brook where we live, Alice, my wife, and I thought we ought to have a proper go. We hacked down and ground out the roots of multiple uncontrolled shrubs over the autumn and winter, and having had a very out-of-control hedge laid, we are beginning now to see the fruits of all that drastic action. It is extraordinary how new buds have broken out of such unpromising-looking laid hedge branches. Some of the fruit trees we planted in December that have been flooded three times, as the Abberd has risen in times of flood, are blossoming already. The area of turf that we transplanted from a new patio area into the bare places the shrubs came out of are looking a bit like intended lawn!

Plant growth like this is such a good metaphor for the Christian life. St Paul writes to the rather wayward Corinthian church about how both he and another Christian leader Apollos have planted and watered the seeds of faith in the people of this church. But it's God who gives the growth, he points out.

I sometimes wonder whether we're tempted to settle for a level of faith which is more like a carefully curated collection of historical artefacts than a God-blessed Garden. Those artefacts may well be of real interest and merit, but they aren't alive as such. With a garden – or any living thing really – even something as simple as a leaf or a flower has the potential to take our breath away in the way it's so intricately formed and can grow out of nothing.

May God reinvigorate our faith this spring time, and dazzle us with fresh understandings of his love for us and all he has made, and lead us into new insights as to how he wants us to share in his purposes for the world.

History of the Telephone Kiosk – Part 1

Last month I mentioned how Community Heartbeat (that's the national body) had agreed with BT to adopt existing no-longer used telephone boxes as safe locations for defibrillators. This got me researching the history of the famous red tox.

Early phone kiosks were strange devices that were more like garden sheds than the phone boxes we know today. They came in multiple shapes and sizes and sometimes looked like decorative garden features with thatched roofs and stained glass. Lots of these boxes

required payment to enter and some even had attendants! In 1912 the GPO took over the operation of phone boxes and started the

process of standardisation. The first of the K series of kiosks appearing in 1920/1.

The K1 (kiosk 1) was the first GPO built kiosk. Constructed of three concrete panels with a wooden door and a pyramid style roof that was topped off with a ball. Three versions were made, the differences being the windows and roof!



The Sky at Night



The Eta Aquariid meteor shower is active between 19^{th} April and 28^{th} May, coming to a climax around 6^{th} May with up to 50 meteors per hour.

This shower is more visible for the Southern Hemisphere and will appear low in the sky in the Northern Hemisphere in the early hours pre-dawn.

However, it should still be possible to see the shower in the eastern sky, even when the radiant is below the horizon. This year the maximum on May 6 happens two days before new Moon, making good viewing conditions.

If you look eastwards, you'll see the star Eta Aquariid in the constellation of Aquarius, after which the meteor shower is named. The source of the meteor shower is the famous Halley's Comet, which is visible from Earth every 75-76 years.

Next May 2025 the boundaries of the existing Parish will be changed and your property will be in a new Parish. The New Derry Hill and Studley Parish Council will start work in May 2025, and will cover Studley, Derry Hill, Sandy Lane and Pewsham.

Calne Neighbourhood Policing Team Update

Police Crime and incident updates

Incidents

In early April, unknown suspect(s) stole 2 packets of biscuits and toilet rolls from Christ Church, Derry Hill.

On 25/04/2024 00:12hrs, following a single vehicle collision in Fishers Brook a driver provided a positive breath sample at the roadside. The male driver was arrested on suspicion of driving over the prescribed limit of alcohol and taken to hospital due to sustaining minor injuries.

On 26/04/2024, a male was reported as missing in Chippenham. Multiple police units were searching the surroundings fields and areas of Derry Hill, Hilmarton, Foxham, Chippenham and Compton Bassett throughout the afternoon and into evening. Thankfully, the male was found safe and well.

Wiltshire Roads Policing Day of action.

On Wednesday 24th April our Roads Policing officers targeted the Calne and Derry Hill area in a clampdown on various traffic offences.

Speed checks were conducted in Sandpit Road in Calne.

A Mercedes was stopped on the A4 Cherhill travelling at 100mph. The driver apparently needed the toilet (having recently left their house). The driver was issued some paper(work) for the offence!

A brown Range Rover was stopped in Calne due to the dark window tints, despite many lies and protesting recent purchase of



insurance there was no such policy... plus cords exposed on a tyre and no tax. The Driver was reported for the offences and the vehicle was seized.

A motorcyclist was stopped in Calne for not displaying L plates. Rider was reported for the offence for the second time!

A driver of a skip lorry was issued a ticket for not wearing a seatbelt. A tractor was stopped where the driver was reported for not having a secure load.

Safeguarding

Police visit licensed premises, shops and hotels to check safeguarding measures.

Neighbourhood officers joined forces with police cadets last week to test safeguarding procedures and raise awareness of child sexual exploitation at local hotels.

Working alongside the Neighbourhood Harm Reduction Unit (NHRU), plain clothes officers attempted to book a room with an underage cadet at several hotels in the Chippenham, Calne and Corsham areas as part of Hotel Watch.

This was carried out to test the safeguarding procedures at the hotels. Follow up visits will now be carried out with the hotel managers to those that failed, with an emphasis on education around exploitation and the signs to look out for rather than punishment.

The following day, neighbourhood offices from Corsham joined police cadets to once again carry out vape test purchases in the local area.

Insp Pete Foster said: "It's crucial that we continue to test our local stores, hotels and pubs to ensure steps are being taken to protect our young people from harm.

"By using our volunteer police cadets, it enables us to test our local premises safely and highlights the businesses we need to work closely with in order to make improvements."

Cold Callers

We are aware of cold callers going door to door selling items in the area without Pedlars Certificates – so called "Nottingham Knockers" recently in our area.

These people may often offer household cleaning products for sale from rucksacks or suitcases.Please be vigilant, do not purchase anything and never hand over cash on your doorstep.

If you feel threatened, close the door and contact police.



Always ensure your property is fully secure.

Look out for your elderly neighbours.

The items offered are often of low quality and advertised at inflated prices.

The "sales pitches" can also be part of a wider operation to identify burglary targets.

Those involved may claim to be part of rehabilitation schemes and could produce ID cards – these are entirely false and have no legal bearing.

Never buy anything from these people and report them to police. Always dial 999 in an emergency.



Book Club Review Big Brother by Lionel Shriver

Shriver's 2010 novel about her obese elder brother, Greg, was preceded by an article, wherein she calls out the "fat pride community", describing the life of a 55-year-old man weighing 24 stone and whose breathing is so restricted that he "drags a portable oxygen tank with him like a faithful dog". Her brother died shortly after the article was published. *Big Brother* is her attempt to answer the questions that troubled her – could she, should she have saved him?

The central character is Pandora, the middle-aged middle child in a middle-



class American family, unexpectedly rich from her invention of a doll, living with her craftsman husband (Fletcher) and his two teenage children. She loves her big brother Edison, but when he invites himself to stay, she fails to recognise him at the airport. In the 4-year absence, the once slim, 'hip' New York jazz pianist has gained hundreds of pounds. After Edison has more than overstayed his welcome, Fletcher delivers his wife an ultimatum: It's him or me.

Whilst the central topic is our relationship with food and attitudes to fat, for me, *Big Brother* raised many additional issues, including the fragility of family dynamics; the emotional and financial power within relationships, born into and chosen; sibling rivalry and family ties; and the allure and pressures of business and entertainment fame.

For many of the group, the flaws in Shriver's writing style and book structure, her language, the unsympathetic characters and a disconnect with the subject matter were too difficult to overcome. Dislike it they may, but the debate was fast and furious.... food for thought!!

The 2,500 men of the Bowood Camp in 1915

In 1915 as pace gathered in the 1st World War the 1st Mounted Brigade of the Southern Division were under canvas at Bowood. The men were at Bowood for the purpose of completing their training. Lord Lansdowne had placed the estate at the disposal of the



military authorities. The papers report that the change from being billeted in private and licensed houses in towns to tents pitched in Bowood's beautiful surroundings was most welcomed by the men.



The Brigade consisted of the second line units of the Royal Wilts, North Somerset, Dorset and Hants Regiments of Yeomanry the Hampshire Royal Horse Artillery, the Field Ambulance, the Medical Corps and the Transport and Supply Column. There were 2,500 men camped in

Bowood.

The camp ran from just inside the Golden Gates, past Queens Wood, and down as far as Rumsey House. The Wiltshire's being the home county regiment were given the place of honour near the Golden Gates. The supplies for the 2,500 arrived at Black Dog Halt.

The papers report that the inhabitants of Chippenham and Calne regretted the departure of the men when they left later in 1915 to meet their destiny on the Western Front. The conduct of the men was reported as exemplary with not one complaint received by the police as to their behaviour.



So, when you take a walk along the golf course from the Golden Gates to Studley Lodge, take a moment to remember the 2,500 men who spent 1915 preparing for war. They had no idea what awaited them in France. Many of them didn't return.






